



COMMENTS FROM OUR MANAGER

Elsewhere in this issue you will find a two-month preview calendar entitled, "COMING EVENTS". This will be in addition to the usual full chart for the current month. We hope that this will accomplish several important results as follows:

- 1. To allow YOU to plan ahead.
- To prevent last minute guest arrivals at food functions and special events, where the kitchen is expected to have the proper amount of food available without having a definite advance count of guests.
- 3. To <u>prevent</u> late arrival of Elk-O-Gram and inserts with details on special events.
- 4. To allow special event committees to reserve dates well in advance to prevent conflict of groups; gives the committees better choice of dates; allows more time for promotional activities and provides accurate information for scheduling the correct number of employees to give proper service.
- 5. To provide our staff better control of inventories and purchases, which would thus conserve Lodge funds.
- 6. By spacing out special events, attendance at individual events should improve.
- By being informed earlier, the results will be better and each of you should be happier, better served, and more satisfied.

BANQUET PROCEDURES

Reservation deadline will be one week prior to the event.

Called D-Day. Up to that time tickets sold at regular price but after D-Day ticket price goes up 20%. The count of the reservations recorded on D-Day will be the guaranteed minimum charged. The Club will be prepared to serve 5% over the guarantee. The final count will be recorded not less than two days prior to the event. That will be the room set up count, as well as the final count served and paid for. In the event that the original or expected count has not been reached by D-Day, the function will be rescheduled for a later date.


