Statue of Liberty



Health tip of the Month

Diabetes

Two people out of every one hundred have diabetes. But of those two people, only one knows that he or she has the disease. Like high blood pressure, diabetes may produce few noticeable symptoms. But, as with high blood pressure, a doctor can easily detect the presence of the disease and prescribe effective treatment to control it.

Diabetes is a disease caused by inadequate production of the hormone insulin. Scattered groups of cells within the pancreas, known as islets of Langerhans, secrete the hormone insulin. Insulin regulates the body's use of sugar. Without insulin, your body cannot use sugar properly.

There are two types of diabetes. The most common type usually occurs in middle or old age. Symptoms include unusual thirst, a craving for sweets, fatique, and loss of weight. Diabetes also affects young people which is called juvenile diabetes. Also, women suffer from diabetes more than men.

Diabetes cannot be cured, but it can be controlled. In most instances, however, diabetics must take insulin pills or shots everyday. By maintaining the weight that is right for you, you can help protect yourself from diabetes as well as from athersclerosis, high blood pressure, and degenerative arthritis.

Why do we have an 11 o'clock toast?

How many really know the background and how the custom of the 11 o'clock toast came about?


The first 11:00 toast was delivered on May 31, 1868, at a social function.

Regular meetings of subordinate Lodges have always been held at night. In the earlier days they were usually held on Sunday nights and were concluded about 11:00 p.m. As the participants departed they naturally made inquiries about the absentees and expressed sympathetic interest in the cause of their absence.

It soon became a custom when the members had gone to some other place for some of them to propose a toast to the Brothers who were not present. And, in the course of time, this custom was quite generally observed whenever a group of Elks gathered together at eleven o'clock.

This toast, which ends with "To our Absent Brothers," is a means to recall the sentiment with a moment of dignified silence. We want to impress upon Elks and their guest that "An Elk is never forgotten, never forsaken."

We still have space on the bus to Columbia, Missouri. The time has been changed to 11:30 a.m. for the game. Therefore the bus will leave from the Elks Lodge at 4:00 p.m. on Friday, October 18th and stay in Kansas City overnight. We will depart for Columbia at 7:30 a.m. and come home to Lincoln after the game. 


