



Health Tip of the Month Weight Control

While many factors, affect weight, most people gain weight when they take in more calories than they burn up. A calorie is a unit of food energy. Weight is lost when fewer calories are taken in than are burned up.

If you need to lose weight, there are two ways to do it. You could decrease the number of calories you take in each day. Or you could increase the amount of exercise you do each day.

The number of calories varies in different foods. Learning about calories can help in planning a diet. It offers the dieter freedom to choose. Different types of foods that have different calorie and nutritional values can be chosen.

When dieting, one must be careful to include foods from all four basic food groups. Cutting calories does not mean cutting nutrients.

A person can lose weight on a diet that includes all the proper foods but in smaller amounts. One should not plan to lose large amounts of weight each week. One to two pounds is a reasonable amount of weight to lose in one week. This will make the weight loss slow but steady. The person will be more likely to keep the weight off permanently.

Next month I will focus on how to use exercise to help lose weight.

You can be proud of your lodge's accomplishments, its officers, trusties, and committees. They work and work hard for Elkdom.


