### CONGRATULATIONS TO EVERYONE

Special thanks to all the co-chairmen and agencies for the wonderful co-operation to make this event

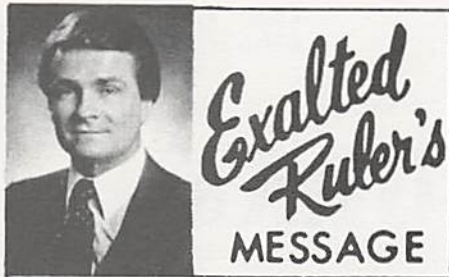

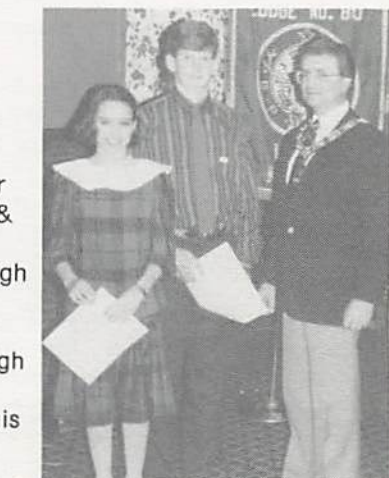

# Health tip

There is a facility that is now available in the club. I am referring to the fitness center. The equipment that is available can give you a full workout. This room is just waiting to be used and you, as a club member, should take advantage of this fine facility. The equipment ready to be used are a stationary bicycle, a treadmill, and a universal weight machine.

The bicycle and treadmill will increase your cardiovascular endurance. The weight machine will improve your muscular strength and endurance. When doing exercise, you need to try and reach your maximum attainable heart rate. To find what you M.A.H.R. is, subtract your age from 220. Depending on your age you should elevate your heart rate 50½ to 70½ of your M.A.H.R. and keep it there from 10-15 minutes in order to attain aerobic fitness. You should exercise 3-4 times a week to stay physically fit.

Let me remind you what some of the benefits of physical fitness are: a high energy level; optimal muscle strength, endurance, mobility; good nutrition; excellent mental health; the ability to rest and sleep better. Remember to see your doctor before starting a fitness program.

Stop in and use your fitness center. In the near future there will be charts and graphs to illustrate what you should be doing for a fitness program.

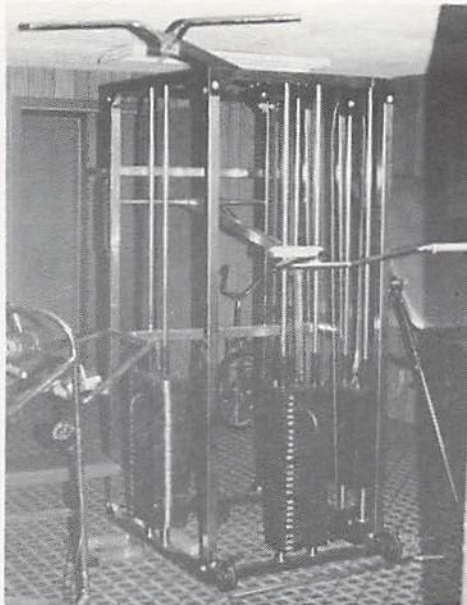
