
Youth Day



Ritual Is For Everyone

When a brother Elk thinks of Ritual—The first thing that comesto mind is the Initiation Ritual. True, its importance is kept in our minds every month when the Lodge Officers perform this ceremony. Also, by the fine work Lincoln #80 has shown in the District, State, and National Contests.

But I would like to remind each and every Brother of another form of Ritual that is for **each** member. I am speaking of the Elk's Funeral Ritual that is available to every member in good standing in our Order.

I have had the opportunity to arrange for most every type of special ceremony by virtue of my profession, and have seen many fine organizations perform their renditions of their funeral rites. As a personal opinion, I find the Elk's Service among the best.

The Benevolent and Protective

Order of Elk's thinks very highly of those Brothers who are no longer in our presence. The Eleven O'Clock Toast is a prime example of this remembrance.

Recently the Officers were called upon to do an Elk's Chapel Service. It struck me that this was the first occasion that we had been asked since I became a Lincoln #80 Officer. This leads me to suspect that perhaps our brothers and their families are unaware of this service provided by your lodge. There are basicly two types of Elk's Funeral Ritual. The first is an Elk's Chapel Service. This is held in conjunction with the mortuary or Church Service. The second is the Elk's Gradeside ritual, held at the location of burial, entombment, etc.

Either of these are performed by the current Officers of #80, as are available with the assistance of P.E.R.'s as necessary. It is very important to make your Funeral Director aware that an Elk's Service is desired and what specific type is requested. He will then arrange and coordinate these details with the lodge. Also mention of membership should be noted in the obituary even if an Elk's Service is not requested. This allows the Funeral Director to display our Elk's Floral Tribute. I and every Funeral Director in town has this in their possession strictly for this purpose.

For additional information regarding this subject, please contact me personally or our Lodge Secretary.

On behalf of all the Officers, I would like to express our desire and willingness to participate in the capacity for our members. This is not an infringement on the Lodge—but rather an honor and duty to a Brother.
