### Elks National Foundation

Popularly referred to as the "Great Heart of Elkdom", the National Foundation was started in 1928 to create and maintain a persupporting fund manent charitable, educational and benevolent activities. The growth of this fund relies on voluntary gifts and subscriptions without compulsion of any kind. In order to keep the fund permanent, guidelines dictate that only the interest is available for use. Even with this restriction, over \$8 million is distributed annually, funding the Drug Awareness Program, the "Most Valuable Student" annual scholarship competition, Vocational Grant assistance, Veterans Hospital Programs and many more very worthy endeavors.

One need not be an Elk or a relative to receive benefits from the Elks National Foundation, so it follows that participation is not limited to Elks alone. Donors may be ladies, non-Elks, families, groups, companies, corporations or anyone who believes in the good works of the Foundation.

The most popular form of participation is the \$100 Participating Pledge which is generally payable at the rate of \$10 per year, or in full. The Honorary Founder plege and the Permanent Benefactor pledge are for amounts of \$1000 and payable in increments of \$100, or in full.

#### HOSPITALIZATION: Eligibility -

Discharge or release from the active military service under conditions other than dishonorable.

#### General Admission Priorities:

First .. Veterans needing hospitalization because of injuries or disease incurred or aggravated in line of duty in active service have top priority for admission for treatment of the service-incurred or service-aggravated disability.

Second - Veterans who were discharged or retired for disability incurred or aggravated in line of duty or who are receiving compensation, or would be eligible to receive compensation, except for receipt of retirement pay, who need treatment for some ailment

### Veterans Benefits #2

not connected with their service, will be admitted as beds are available.

Third -- Veterans who were not discharged or retired for disability or are not receiving compensation, and who apply for treatment of a nonservice-connected disability may be admitted to a VA medical center (1)if hospitalization is deemed necessary, (2)if they are unable to defray the cost of necessary hospital charges elsewhere and (3)if beds are available. NOTE: The "Inability to Pay" requirement does not apply to any veteran who is 65 years of age or older, is in receipt of VA pension, is eligible for medicaid, is rated serviceconnected, or is a former Prisoner of War (POW). Also the requirement does not apply to veterans re-

questing medical services in connection with exposure to dioxin or exposure to toxic substance in herbicide or defoliant (such as Agent Orange) used for military purposes in Vietnam, August 5, 1964, through May 7, 1975; or to veterans requesting medical services in connection with exposure to ionizing radiation from the detonation of a nuclear device as a result of participation in either the testing of such a device or the American occupation of Hiroshima or Nagasaki, Japan, between September 11, 1945, and July 1, 1946.

Apply at any VA medical facility. Next month there will be an article regarding Nursing Home Care in the Veterans Administration.


