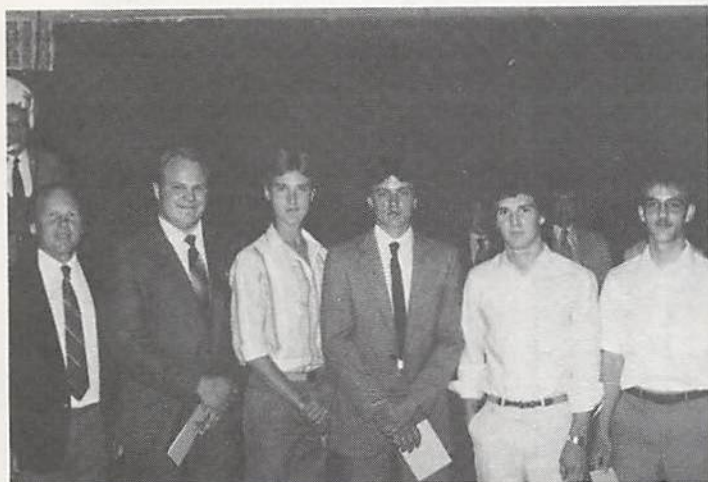

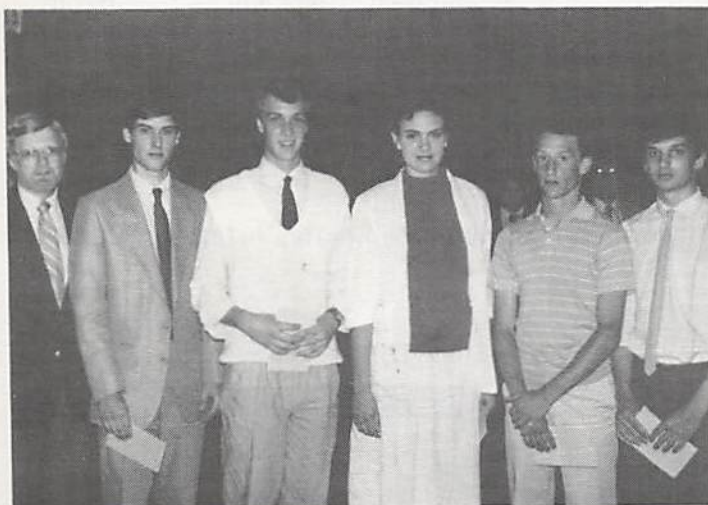

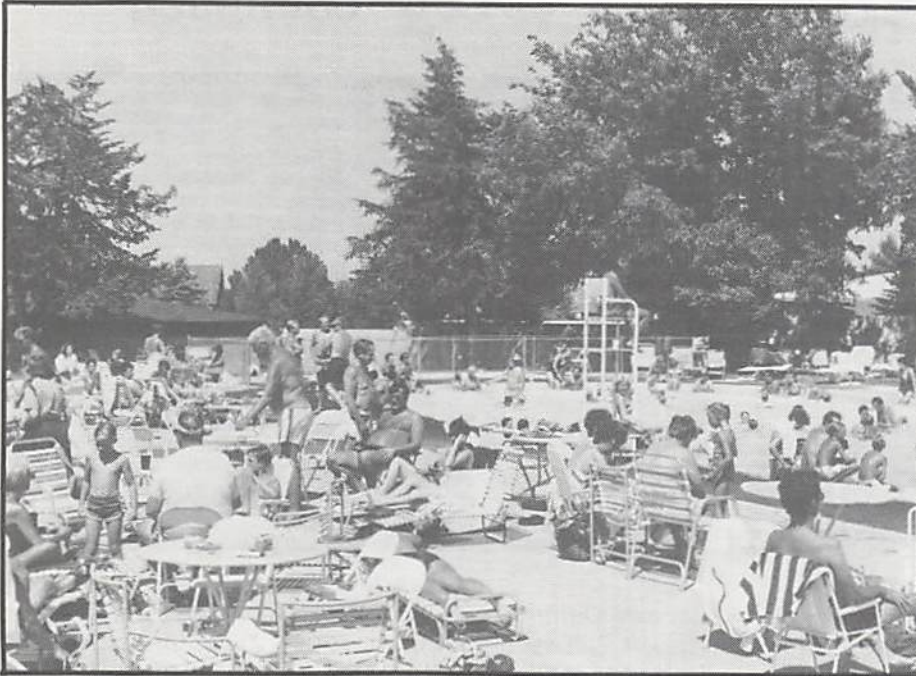

Veterans Administration Sets New Eligibility Procedures:

VA TO IMPLEMENT NEW HEALTH CARE ELIGIBILITY PROCEDURES JULY 1, 1986

The Veterans Administration will begin implementing new eligibility assessment procedures on July 1 to determine nonservice-connected veterans' eligibility for cost-free VA health care.

Mr. Max Lybarger, director of the Lincoln VA Medical Center, said the income-based assessment, required by the Veterans' Health Care Amendments of 1986, is designed to ensure that VA inpatient care is provided to service-connected and lower-income veterans. Veterans with higher incomes will be eligible for VA health care on a space-available basis, and some may be charged a deductible based on their level of income.

Mr. Lybarger said most nonservice-connected veterans applying for VA health care will be required to provide information on their total income for the preceding year. Proof of income will not be required beyond filling out an application form. Veterans are being urged to have this information with them when they apply for health care at a VA facility after July 1.

Specifically, he said, the law establishes three eligibility categories for VA inpatient care, nursing home and outpatient care. VA is required to provide inpatient care to veterans in Category A, and is permitted to provide health care to veterans in Categories B and C on a space-available basis. Veterans in Category C must agree to pay a deductible. He went on to state that "This legislation allows VA to provide medical care to most veterans at no cost."

Category A veterans, the highest level of priority, are those with service-connected disabilities, former prisoners of war, veterans of World War I and earlier wars, nonservice-connected veterans in receipt of Medicaid benefits, or a VA pension, and certain other nonservice-connected veterans. The law directs the VA to provide needed care to call Category A veterans at no cost to the veteran.

Category B veterans are those nonservice-connected veterans whose annual incomes are below \$20,000 if single, \$25,000 if mar-

ried, plus \$1,000 for each additional dependent. The law authorizes the VA to furnish care to Category B veterans on a space available basis at no cost to the veteran.

Finally, Category C veterans are those nonservice-connected veterans whose annual incomes are above \$20,000 if single, \$25,000 if married, plus \$1,000 for each additional dependent. These veterans may receive VA medical care on a space available basis if they agree to make a copayment not to exceed approximately \$500 for each 90-day billing period during which a veteran is receiving medical care. Mr. Lybarger encourages veterans to call Medical Administration Service, 402/489-3802, ext. 350 to inquire further about their eligibility.

Although the new procedures are effective July 1, veterans receiving inpatient care prior to July 1 will not be affected until their current treatment is completed. The assessment also will not apply during July and August to veterans now receiving outpatient care.

There were two outstanding groups of candidates who became members of Lincoln Lodge #80 in the last two months: a total of over 34 new members in June and July. Welcome to all of the new brothers.

The Trustees are happy to report that the operation of the club facility is running ahead of budget for the first quarter of the lodge fiscal year. Thanks to all of you for your patronage of your club.

A special event called Beer and Burger Night was started in June and we moved 250 hamburgers for

50 cents. We repeated this event in July and, moved almost 500 hamburgers, in fact we ran out of beer twice and hamburgers once or twice. The response to this event was great. There will be another Beer and Burger night in August on Tuesday, August 12th. More detail is elsewhere in this Elk-O-Gram. Wouldn't it be great to serve 700 hamburgers in August.

Speaking of the Elk-O-Gram the Board of Trustees are aware that the July issue was not received by some members until July 8th or 9th. Steps are being taken to assure that this will not happen again. We apologize to those members who didn't learn about the 4th of July activity at the club until after the 4th. You should receive your Elk-O-Gram on the 1st or 2nd of the month.
