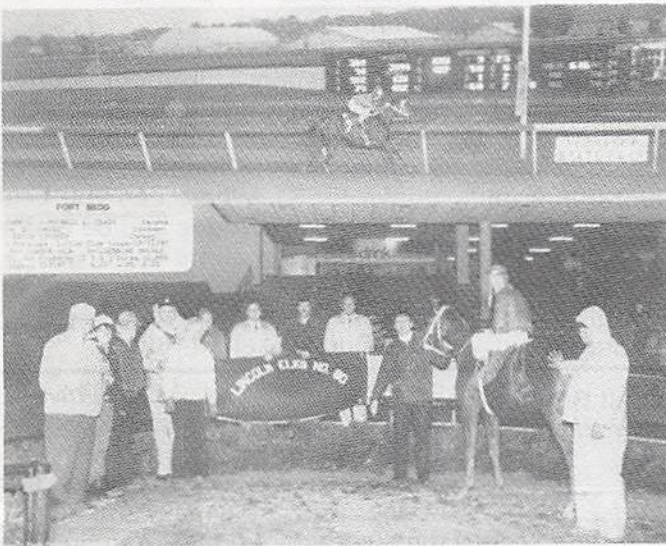

## Babe Ruth League Baseball

Another highly successful season of "Babe Ruth League" baseball has ended. ## Elks National Foundation

Popularly referred to as the "Great Heart of Elkdom," the National Foundation was started in 1928 to create and maintain a permanent fund supporting charitable, educational and benevolent activities. The growth of this fund relies on voluntary gifts and subscriptions without compulsion of any kind. In order to keep the fund permanent, guidelines dictate that only the interest is available for use. Even with this restriction, over \$8 million is distributed annually, funding the Drug Awareness Program, the "Most Valuable Student" annual scholarship competition, Vocational Grant assistance, Veterans Hospital Programs and many more very worthy endeavors.

One need not be an Elk or a relative to receive benefits from the Elks National Foundation, so it follows that participation is not limited to Elks alone. Donors may be ladies, non-Elks, families, groups, companies, corporations or anyone who believes in the good works of the Foundation.

The most popular form of participation is the \$100 Participating Pledge which is generally payable at the rate of \$10 per year, or in full. The Honorary Founder pledge and the Permanent Benefactor pledge are for amounts of \$1000 and payable in increments of \$100, or in full.
