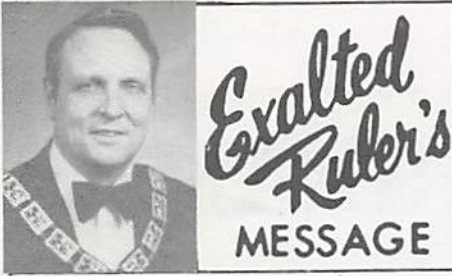

# Elks Football Closes Season

On Monday, November 17, Elks Midget Football brought their season to an official end with its annual awards banquet.

In attendance were nearly 300 parents and players, all who enjoyed an excellent meal prepared by Dave Harrison and his staff.

Following the dinner, awards were handed out to all players. Along with a team photo and certificate of achievement, each player who participated on a city championship team received a trophy commemorating the accomplishment.

This year, in the leagues four different classes, the elks had three city champions and one runner-up. With these current winners, Elks Midget Football has won 12 out of a possible 16 city championships since 1982, making the Elks the most dominating team in the history of the league.

To bring the banquet to a close was the presentation of the "Shawn Schwaller Memorial Award." This award is presented in loving memory of Shawn Jeffrey Schwaller who played for the Elks in 1982 and died due to a shooting accident during the summer of 1983.

The award is given on the basis of five categories: sportsmanship, moral conduct, attitude, leadership, and effort. It is NOT a most valuable player award. This year was a rare exception, with the selection committee being unable to decide between two players. It was then decided that they both be presented with an award. This year's recipients were Matt Boulter and Mike Beetem.

With the close of the 1986 season, the coaches and staff were already hard at work preparing for the next year.

### From Your Pool Committee...

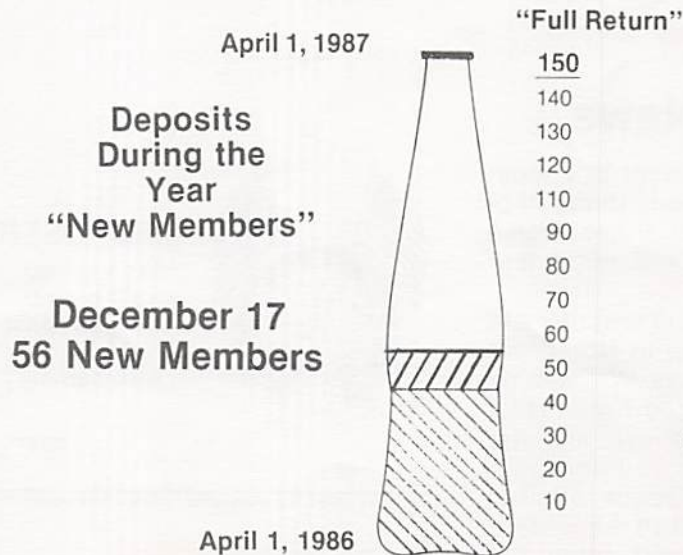
Nice time of year to be thinking of our pool and fun in the sun!!!
