

On Monday, November 17, Elks Midget Football brought their season to an official end with its annual awards banquet.


In attendance were nearly 300 parents and players, all who enjoyed an excellent meal prepared by Dave Harrison and his staff.

Does Installation will be January 17th at the Elks Lodge. Jan Sinkule will be the Does President for 1987. Congratulations Jan!






As of this printing we have in-
