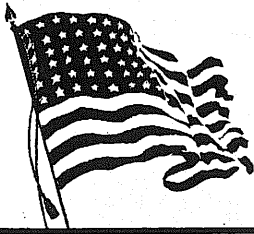

Dear Elk Members:

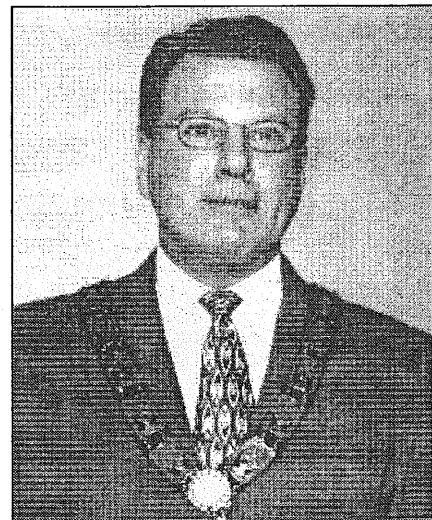

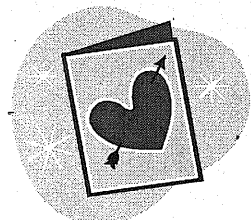

We need people to step up and help sell tickets to our dinners. You asked for more than one dinner a month, the House Committee now plans two a month.

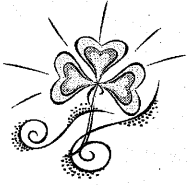

So, come tip a few, enjoy a hearty meal, top it off with a delicious dessert, kiss something green, and have fun -- all for ten bucks!

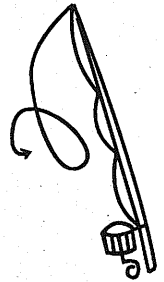

Their children have worked and played together at the Lodge often, the older ones tending to the younger ones and all having a great time.

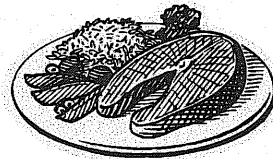

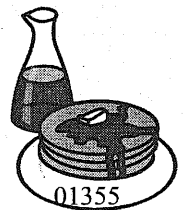
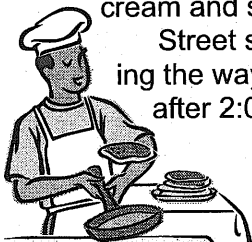
A Pancake Success

The event started around 6:30 a.m. for those volunteers assigned to get the pancake griddle fired up to the right temperature, concentrated orange juice mixed and on ice along with milk and butter, fruit toppings warming in the steam table and coming from the kitchen, the smell of sausages sizzling on the stove top. Final touches were added to the tables which included placemats, syrup, cream and sugar while the aroma of coffee permeated throughout.

Street signs were placed strategically along the entrance of the Trade Center marking the way to our facility. We started serving around 8:00 a.m. and it didn't let up until after 2:00 p.m.

We served approximately 375 individuals in the 6 hour time period. Committee members along with many volunteers from the Elks, Does and their friends helped during pre-assigned work shifts making this event successful.

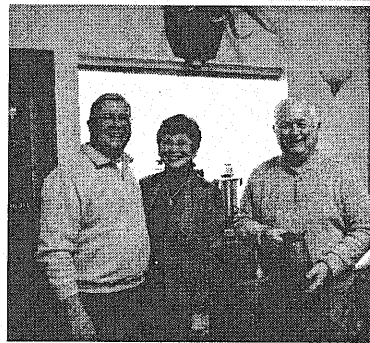
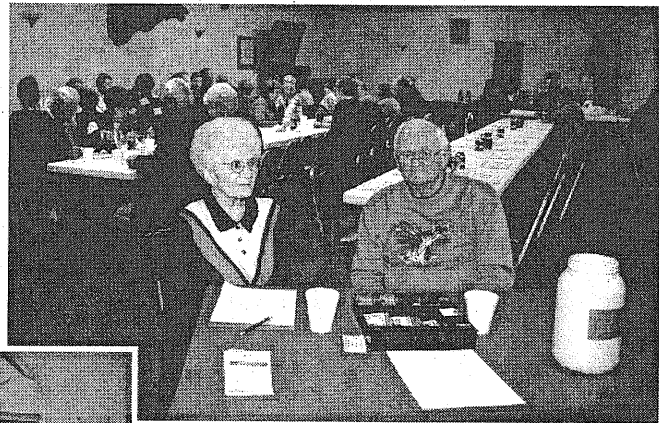




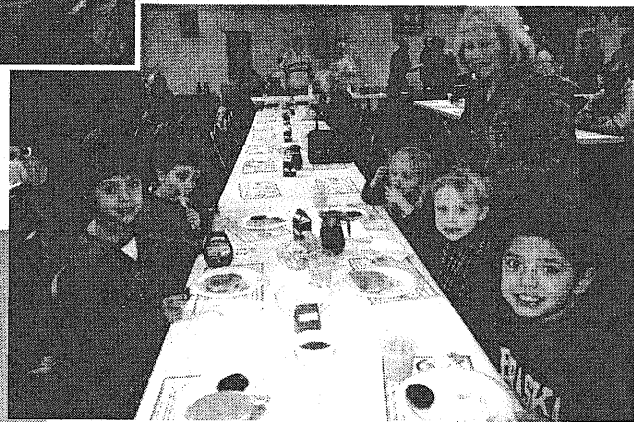

Paul Burklund, a member of Lincoln Elks Lodge #80 for 49 years, celebrated his 100 Birthday February 17th, 2007.

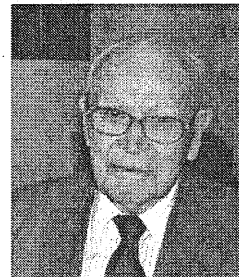
Paul and his wife Sylvia joined us at our St. Valentine's Day dinner which was held Saturday night, February 10th.

Their smiles, great humor and many thanks extended to all during the evening, made their experience very memorable.

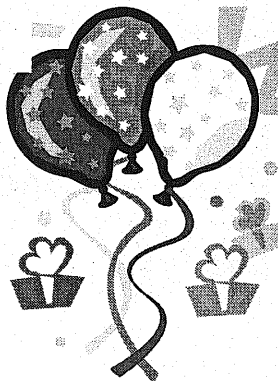

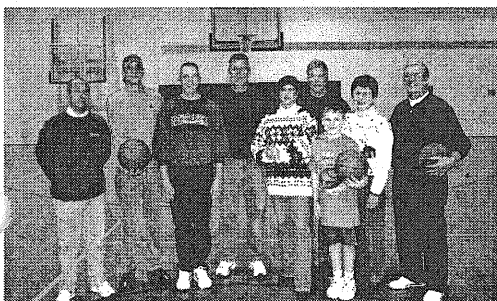
