Memories of Alex "Bud" Dietrich

It is difficult to even recall all of the contributions brother "Bud", on of the greatest Elks to ever be a part of the Lincoln Elks Lodge.

I first met Bud when I became the Chaplain for the Lodge; this must have been about 1980. I would often see this gentleman toiling away doing something for the Lodge. I soon learned that his name was "BUD". Bud was the member who did the most of the repair and maintenance for the old Lodge on South 70th Street. He trimmed the hedges and trees, mowed the grass, maintained the parking lot, repaired the pool and water system for the pool, helped paint the pool, checked the water

purity and level daily, figured out how to slow the water loss from the pool which was a very great expense to the Lodge, touched up the paint where needed and helped to maintain the interior. At one point I kept track of the time Bud spent and determined that he was paid slightly more than one dollar an hour for his work.

Frequently, when the workday was over Bud and I would sit down and review the day's activities and what was still to be accomplished in the next days. Whenever there was an extra task

added by one of the officers you could bet that Bud would be there.

Bud never had a desire to be the chair officer but he served many times as a Trustee for the Lodge #80. In about 1988 there was a concern that our lodge would go into insolvency. Bud and I were two of the five Trustees for the Lodge at the time. The other three resigned, as they did not want to be associated with the possible bankruptcy filings. That left Bud and me with quite a number of bills to contend with and only each other to lean on. We were the Trustees for several months and somehow or another held things together until other Trustees were appointed to help. I recall Gay Blank and Harry Hoffman joining us in the Fall of that year.

Soon after this we started to search for land and later built a new lodge, and here again Bud was one of our silent leaders. He reviewed the proposals, and once a proposal and site were selected, he and Gay Blank began a fundraiser for funds to build our present Lodge. We had planned for the payoff to be many years in the future but with the leadership of Bud and the pledged contributions he helped secure, the Lodge Mortgage Burning Ceremony was held only a year after we moved into our new Lodge.


Our building contract was for the shell, plumbing, heating and air, and electricity; the

finishing of the building was left for the members. And again there was Bud pitching in with the other members who finished the Lodge. Rollie Schesher and Bud laid the quarry tile in the kitchen, and he also helped with the wood floor on the dance floor. And he assisted Bud Lehl laying the carpet.

Once the lodge was completed Bud and Curly Schwindt sold tickets for every Lodge function and event. He personally started Oktoberfest while we were still in the old Lodge. He prepared the sausage himself and with the assis-

tance of his committee, prepared the entire meal. This has been a continued event at our Lodge with other members helping to ensure the great get together at "Oktoberfest".

I can only give praises for the man who held Elkdom in such high regard and devoted so much time and energy to the Lodge. Yes at times he was not pleased with the way something was handled but he never withdrew his support. We would have to look far and wide to find another Elk who would work as hard and be as dedicated and loyal as Bud Dietrich. We have certainly lost a pillar of strength from our lodge. He was and is one of our greatest members and will most certainly be missed by everyone who had the privilege of being a friend and brother of Alex "Bud" Dietrich.
