Pancake Feed a Success!

On January 27th, the Lodge's Charitable Fund group that finances and admin-

isters 18 Scholarships for our area vouth, hosted a Pancake feed for over 300 people.

This was possible because, first, Officers and P.E.R.s sold over 200 tickets; secondly, with the help of advertising and signs leading to the Lodge, over



100 more walked in and enjoyed pancakes, sausage, juice, milk and coffee.

The result was a net profit to the fund of \$2000. This amount will be divided evenly between all the scholarships and will therefore increase their net worth which translates into more financial help for the scholarship winners.

Due to donations of food by IHOP restaurants and Lincoln Poultry and a donation of placemats and signage by FASTSIGNS Inc., plus a cash donation toward the cost of food from Roper & Sons, the overall cost to the fund group was minimal. Other members and friends of the Lodge made cash donations directly to the fund on Sunday.

All of this would not have been possible without the 28 people that donated their time and labor.

Space will not allow us to list everyone, but a few should be noted for their contribution. Sonny Lane furnished the transportation and muscle to pick-up and return the griddle. Merl Hesser and Larry Jurgens stayed at the griddle all day. John Brooks and Scott Jurgens cooked sausage for the entire day. The DOES, as usual, had a strong contingent of workers, including Wauneta Peterson, who played the organ from about 10:30 a.m. to 1:00 p.m.. Dave Kirby, and his two daughters, Erin and Katie put in several hours each as did our Exalted Ruler Terry and his wife Vivian.

Others worked the entire 6 hour session, including Steve Wirth. Pancake Chairman, who also contrib-

uted many hours prior to Sunday and was the main reason everything ran smoothly.

Thanks, again, to all workers and all who had breakfast with us on Sunday.

- NEEDED: Bar Steward: Ordering food and beverages, inventory control, manage bar staff.




