This time of the year is especially hard for the Lodge to pay our bills on time. Membership dues will not support all of the outstanding bills. This is why we do the cash calendar sales.

I know some of you may not like the fact that we are asking for money from you at this time of the year but it is necessary for us to do.

The cash calendars is a way for us to spread the burden among all of our members. You still have time to get these returned to the Lodge.

We ask that you support us in our efforts to keep the doors open. Our monthly dinners are also a way for you to support the Lodge. Most of the dinners are sponsored and/or cooked by Elk's that really care about our future.


#### **FROM THE DOES Drove #4**
