



Trustees (Larry Schwindt) Questioning of fascia costs are still in process.



Lincoln Lodge No. 80 is happy to help an provide some financial support to a young individual by the name of Elliott Haes. Elliott was born with Spina Bifida eight years ago to his parent Jay and Stephanie of Lincoln. He has two sisters ,Sarah (17) and Piper (14). In December 2009, Elliott was also diagnosed with a tumor in his head which was successfully removed at the Children's Hospital. After tests, it was discovered to be Medulloblastoma, a form of brain cancer. Elliott is a fighter and is currently undergoing chemotherapy in Omaha. These treatments leave him very tired but, he continues to go to school on a daily basis.

Our lodge is contributing \$500. In addition Doyle Butts, then Chairman of the Nebraska Elks Benevolence Commission was contacted and the state is providing \$1,000 in support of Elliott, a total of \$1,500. Our Lodge plans to make this presentation to Elliott and his family, either at our May 5th or May 19th meeting. Elliot's schedule is very busy with Chemo, so his attendance will be very special.
