When I was in the 5th grade I remember writing a story about another Great Uncle of mine, Tom Frank, and how he passed up an opportunity to push a flag up a hill at Iwo Jima. Photographers were there that day and maybe he could get in a picture. He never liked to talk about being at war, but my Mom liked to tell the story about Iwo Jima. I remember asking him about the military tattoos on his arm and him looking down at them and rubbing them and saying they were just something stupid he did when he was a kid. I suppose I was exposed to many other examples in the news and I understood that somewhere people were fighting and if it wasn't happening, the United States was still ready to fight. Even still, I thought, Uncle, don't you want something other than just world peace? And, really, all we have his time, right?




