

His positive attitude and love of life was infectious to all those around him. John also gave so much to our lodge by serving in numerous positions and on committees, including being an Exalted Ruler during which he led by example. He was a ritual man through and through and believed that doing the ritual made you a better Elk and a better person. John also provided the lodge with many services like making signs for not only Lincoln Lodge #80 but also for the State association and any other Lodge that needed something, without asking for anything in return and usually refusing to take any type of compensation for the work that he did.

When I first met John he seemed to be very quiet and reserved. He would just listen and laugh to our stories and comments back and forth in the Lodge kitchen. I soon learned however that he had a very quick wit and would suddenly come up with a comment or story out of the blue that would have you laughing and smiling. John would also come up with some comments and ideas that would blow you away with how deep and insightful they were.

I believe that if Webster's dictionary placed a picture next to the definition of Brotherly Love it would be the picture of John Brooks. I believe that there is not a person that came into contact with John that did not leave as a better person. I believe that the Elk's helped make John the person he was and he in turn helped make the Elk's what they are today.

He had a Kaiser Darrin, which was a fiberglass bodied sports car with retractable doors, a 1954, I believe. Actually had two of them, quite rare. Gaylord Becker has been a member of the lodge for the past 15 or so years and most of you have seen him at the various lodge dinners with his wife Marilue or his entire family. When Gaylord returned from the Army, he worked in a garage in Exeter, Nebraska, and while there he fell in love with Kaiser and Frazer cars. He started a museum in Exeter displaying the cars he collected. He then moved to Lincoln and was a sales manager for Nebraska Book Store and later a successful realtor with Woods Brothers.

In addition to work he was an energetic supporter of various activities in Lincoln. For many years he went weekly to an elementary school and read stories to third graders; he served for years as president of Friendship Force. He has been very active in his church and the Optimists. Gaylord served as Manager (president) of Heart of America Kaiser Frazer Club where I first met him. Gaylord and I passed this job of manager back and forth for many years.

Gaylord had gradually reduced his inventory of cars by donating many to the Minden, Nebraska museum. At the time of his death, he still owned several Kaisers and was actively passing his love of them on to his grandsons. When you see a bright yellow Kaiser Darrin, remember Gaylord, a great person dedicated to helping any and all who needed help. He is a dear friend who should be known as "Mr. Kaiser of Nebraska", a great man and great friend to all who knew him. -Wesley N. Durst PER, PDDGER

By-Law Updates...

At the Lodge meeting held on April 18, a very good discussion was held concerning the by-laws of the Lodge. The changes that were agreed upon, and are listed below, will be on the agenda on May 16 at which time we will vote on the by-laws that will govern our Lodge for the next 5 years. In that time, of course, amendments may be presented and added, but Grand Lodge statutes do not require us to again review the entire set of by-laws until May of 2017.

Here are the changes agreed upon:

1. Article IV - Sec. 2. Since our last review we amended the by-laws to change the meeting starting time to 7 P.M. (previously it was 7:30). This new time will now be included in the printed by-laws.

2. Article V - Sec. 6 (Of the Tiler). Regarding compensation - no change in meaning, just deleted some extra language that was not needed. New will read: "current annual dues plus Grand Lodge per capita fees and State Association dues".

3. Article VI - Sec. 8. This section is new. It was voted in at the Grand Lodge meeting in Phoenix. It is optional whether or not we include it and the members in attendance voted to do so. It will read: Of the degree team - "The Degree Team shall consist of Members of the Lodge, especially qualified in rendition of the Initiatory Ritual appointed by the Exalted Ruler with approval of the Lodge, and shall perform the Initiatory Ritual from memory. All elected and appointed Officers shall have the right to be a part of the Degree Team at their elected or appointed station."

4. Article X: Fees and Dues. Add, 2nd Paragraph: "During the sixty day period between Oct.1 and Nov. 30 of each year, the fee for reinstatement in this Lodge of a member stricken from the rolls of this Lodge for non-payment of dues shall be one (1) dollar."

This paragraph was dropped last time because the 60 day period we had chosen could not be used. As such, we are merely putting back in a by-law we previously included and this time using a time period that is acceptable.

5. Article XV - Correct the spelling of Does Drove #4 (a printers error caused it to read "Does Drive.")

House rules and harassment policies will remain the same.

Attend the meeting on May 16 if you wish to be heard on any of these changes or if you have any suggestions. The revised by-laws will be accepted that night.
