"Special days in June to honor flag and father"

The birth of our nation began with the signing of the Declaration of Independence on July 4, 1776. Those men signing the Declaration began our struggle for freedom. Most of them had relatives living in England. Yet each of them valued liberty above material goods and life and made their commitment a part of the official document. "For the support of this Declaration, with a firm reliance on the protection of the Divine Providence, we mutually pledge to each other our lives, our fortunes and our sacred honor."

Those men kept this pledge! Five signers were captured by the British as traitors and tortured before being put to death. Twelve had their homes ransacked and burned to the ground. The rest saw their property and/or families destroyed. Because of the bravery and dedication of these men, we continue to celebrate them nationwide each July 4 with parades, fireworks and other demonstrations.

As a patriotic organization, it is important to stay focused on the sacrifices of our forefathers. Today, as we enjoy our freedom, we should dedicate a prayer of thanks to those men and their families whose blood and courage forged a new nation consecrated to Liberty, as well as to all who followed in their footsteps in war, fighting to preserve our freedoms through more than two centuries, regardless of the personal cost.

We owe so much to our men and women who have served in our military throughout the world. And as Elks, we proudly stand by our commitment, "So long as there are veterans, the Benevolent and Protective Order of Elks will never forget them!"
