We have often observed that the BPOE is the *"best kept secret in the country."* And why is that? One possible answer is involvement. I would offer that the more visible we are in our communities, the more involved our Members will be and the more people will want to join our Order when they see what we are doing locally. It is vital that our Lodges reach out into the surrounding communities with projects and publicity if we are to survive. But how do we make this happen? Invite them to join in the tasks needed to accomplish the goal. The more people see your dedication to the community, the more likely they will be to want to join our great Order. And don't forget to publicize your progress in your Lodge newsletter. Keeping our Members informed about our charitable projects helps them understand the impact their money has in their own local community.

Reach out in your Lodge and community. Together, we can stop this downward spiral in membership and make a difference going forward – both in our Order and in our community. All we need is +1! Become involved. Become *"A Beacon of Hope"* and invite others to do the same. Dear Elks,
