

The MC for the party was once again, the one and only, Amy Jacobsen, who did a masterful job again this year. The entertainment started with national baton twirling champion Steffany Lien, who volunteered her time to help us with the entertainment. Steffany was then followed by Janene Harris, who is a magician that used doves and rabbits in her act. Next was Toby Kid, juggler who uses various props during his act. We were then entertained by Steffany again, and finally, Gayle Becwar came out and performed as a comedian and magician. After all of the entertainment had concluded, there was an appearance by the one and only Santa Claus. As everyone was leaving, the kids were each given a bag of goodies. As in past years, the bags that were left over were given to various organizations, including the Veterans, Peoples City Mission, Cedars Home for Children, Fresh Start (A shelter for homeless women) and the daycare at the Federal building.
