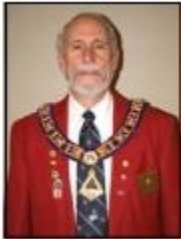
## Knights' Tales

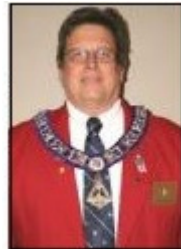
