## Mission Accomplished! Back to Back Champions!!

Elk members of Lincoln Lodge No. 80, as well as all Elks across the State of Nebraska, can be proud of the accomplishment of our Ritual Team in Indianapolis, Indiana during the 151<sup>st</sup> National Elks Convention the week of July 5<sup>th</sup> thru the 8<sup>th</sup>. Another stellar performance was presented by LEL#80 Officers, which brought the National Ritual Championship back to Nebraska for the 2<sup>nd</sup> year in a row. Lincoln performed in the Western Division on Sunday, at 1:00 p.m. and finished with a score of **97.6560** to win the West and a berth in the Final Four. In addition, by winning the West, Lincoln received 7 All American awards. On Tuesday, Lincoln performed for a second time at 2:00 p.m. in the Final Four and finished with a team score of **96.9103**. The announcement of the National Championship team wasn't known until Wednesday morning at the awards presentation portion of the convention. The teams of the Final Four finished as follows: Dalton, GA (#1267) 4<sup>th</sup>, Blue Springs, MO (#2509) 3<sup>rd</sup>, Bridgeport, PA (#714) 2<sup>nd</sup>, and Lincoln, NE (#80) 1<sup>st</sup>. #### Orientation is Key to Membership and Retention

The strength and vitality of any organization largely depends on its ability to maintain and increase membership, and in that regard, I expect us to soon begin reversing the decline in membership that we have been experiencing since the 1980s. However, membership is like anything else; you cannot keep doing the same old thing and expect to get better results. What is your Lodge really doing to address membership? Do you have an active Membership Committee, or do you simply pay lip service to membership, and hope that people will knock on your door for an application?

Every Lodge should have an "active" Membership Committee that reviews and becomes familiar with the Grand Lodge Membership Manual that offers many great ideas for attracting new Members, reinstatements and Stray Elks. It should be a committee that meets at least monthly to set goals, publicize membership classes, discuss incentives, review delinquents, develop collection strategies and find ways to take advantage of social media and the Lodge website.

Even the Lodges that seem to do a good job with recruiting new Members often have difficulty with retention. This may be because we fail the new Member at orientation by not doing enough to assist them in getting quickly involved at the Lodge and actually "experience" Elkdom. Orientation should be considered the "First Step in Member Retention," and I urge every Lodge to adopt an "Orientation Process." This process begins with the application for membership, and does not end until after an informative orientation, an impressive initiation, and, most importantly, not until we get the new Member quickly involved in his or her very first Lodge activity.

Seek a commitment from the candidate at orientation to get quickly involved in an upcoming event, and establish a follow-up program, thereby assisting the new Member to "jump-start" his or her career in Elkdom. This will give each new Member a reason to return to the Lodge, get comfortable with their surroundings, meet active Members, experience the sense of accomplishment that comes from participation, and provide a real sense of belonging and contributing to "their" Lodge. In short, it creates a better opportunity to become a true and faithful Member – one who will be more inclined to life membership in the Order, and less likely to become dissatisfied and drop out.

I hope that each of you will join with me this year to help strengthen the compelling message that "Elks Care – Elks Share" by promoting "Elks Pride and Community Focus" in your Lodge and by working to increase your membership numbers.

Dear Fellow Elks: My co-worker, Bill Wheeler and his wife, Carrie Wheeler have a child named Sam. Sam is a very loving, outgoing 3 year old. Sam was born January 30th 2012. At a very early age, Bill and Carrie knew something was a little off with Sam. Before the age of one he was diagnosed with a seizure disorder. Throughout Sam's short three years of life he has had multiple surgeries on his eyes, MRI's and EEG's. Back in April this year, he was diagnosed with severe Autism due to medication he has taken in the past. Sam is non-vocal. He communicates through some sign language and banging his head.

We are trying to raise money so Bill and Carrie can purchase a specialized communicator/computer so that Sam can communicate with them. They are in need of \$5,000 to cover the cost of this communicator/computer for Sam. The Elks Lodge #80 has already donated funds to this cause, along with several members donating to this cause through the <a href="www.gofundme.com/bwvdj5c">www.gofundme.com/bwvdj5c</a> site for Sam. Bill and Carrie have had to spend lots of money for Dr. appointments and equipment to keep him safe at home.

Sam goes to Maxey Elementary School during the school year and attends Sheridan Lutheran preschool. Carrie is a preschool teacher and has been for 12 years. Bill works at BNSF Railroad doing track maintenance. Even though they work very hard to support their two kids there are things that Sam needs that insurance does NOT cover.
