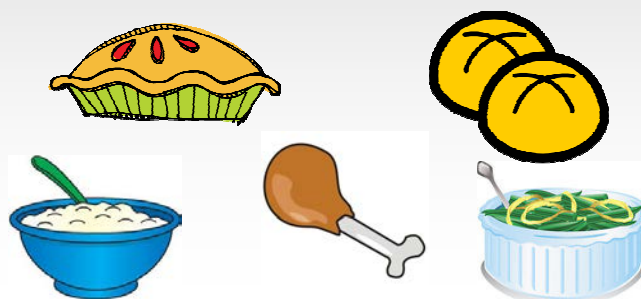

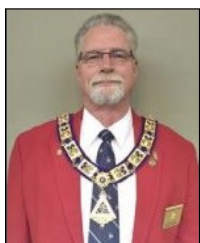

Military Kids Donation

On Friday evening, October 30th, 2015, LEL#80's very own (good witch) Est.
