

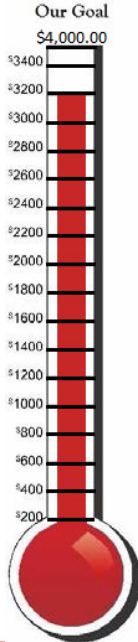

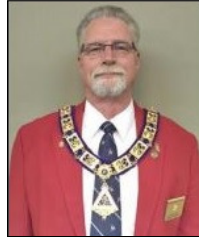
Knight's Tales

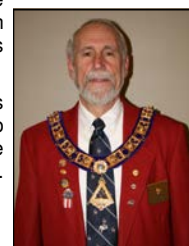

The 108th Children's Christmas party is now in the record books.
