Now Phase II has begun and it's time to iron out all the little kinks and quirks while getting ready for the State competition to be held in North Platte on April 22nd, 23rd and 24th. Elect Mary Brooks is following up on that ... put the Fish Fry on your calendar, April 19. A ways out, but plan for it now ... Teen of the Month is March 6 and 20th, at the Lodge. Please come to support our youth and teachers, we are so proud of those who "get it right" and a great turnout reinforces the importance of that ... Wade informs us the Veterans Freedom Music Festival is coming in June, there will be lots of activities, car shows, etc that the Elks will be involved in, please contact him to see how to help ... as some of you know, our dish sanitizer bit the dust, developed a leak the size of Niagara Falls. It's fruitless to repair, so it is replacement time. We bought it used and patched it together several years ago, so instead of buying another "oldie but goodie" and band-aiding it together, the House Committee decided that getting a full fledged dishwasher, a new one with a warranty and the latest energy conserving features, green-friendly, etc. would be the way to go. If we get a nice one, we can plan for it to last 20 years or more. In checking with Hockenburg's, it appears that a top of the line Hobart, installed, would run no more than \$7500, so the House Committee recommended to the Trustees to authorize an expenditure for up to that amount, to purchase a new dishwasher, installed. The Trustees heartily agreed. Harry Montag and other interested parties working on this are doing the research and will move forward with the acquisition of a new dishwasher, whether it is a Hobart or other well known name brand unit, and come up with the best equipment value for the dollar. As always, your House Committee and Trustees strive to be good stewards of the Lodge's money, and this is one of those times it is better to spend the \$\$ for something decent and long lasting. We will be doing a fundraiser in the Lodge to pay for this equipment, as that is not something we have budgeted for ... Speaking of budgets, by the time you read this, the Budget Committee will have met and hammered out most of the upcoming years budget. As you know, our budget is based largely on our membership and dinner income, and we have been steadily losing members. That is why it is SO important for you to recruit new members into the Lodge. We seem to lose about 20 a year to death, moving, failure to renew, etc. We need to bring in nearly two new members a month to break even ... and it takes 100 members' yearly dues to replace a dishwasher. Doesn't leave much for the light bill, the insurance, the phone, etc. Please recruit new people into our Lodge. It was designed for 800, right now we are at 255. Please come and eat lunch, come to the dinners, support your Lodge. After all, it is here for your enjoyment, and to enable you to serve others, which is the foundation and groundwork of our Order ... Please welcome our new slate of Officers, and our new P.E.R. Elect Mary Brooks, and support her as she shoulders the load of leadership for our Lodge this Fraternal year ... by the way, if you come to the Lodge for St. Patty's Day dinner, Beer n Burger, or any of the many other activities at your Lodge, check out the nifty paint job in the restrooms. They look so bright and fresh. The repairs to the men's room are remarkable, the problems that plagued us in the past are gone.
