Flag Day, an Elks Tradition!



Traditionally, Flag Day is observed on June 14th. The Benevolent and Protective Order of Elks have officially designated this date as Flag Day since 1907, yet this observance didn't become a national one until 1949. It was when President Harry Truman himself, a member of the Elks in Independence, Missouri, made the proclamation that thereafter, June 14 would be a day of national observance for the symbol of our country. Lincoln Lodge No. 80 held its Flag Day ceremony on Sunday, June 12th because of a scheduled conflict in the lodge room. Exalted Ruler Mary Brooks and her officers conducted this Grand Lodge mandatory service at 1:00 p.m. The History of the Flag was presented by PER Larry Schwindt, Response was presented by PER Larry Bratt and music was provided by Wauneta Peterson. All present recited the Pledge of Allegiance to our Flag. Assistant Scout Master Pam Chandler and members of Boy Scout Troops 159 and 456 presented the nine various flags during the reading. Refreshments, with brownies and cookies, followed for all to enjoy.

Flag Tribute

Competition was pretty competitive at the Nebraska State Association Spring conference in North Platte. After the regular business session was recessed on Saturday around 11:30 a.m. the Flag Tribute, 11 O'clock Toast and the Jolly Corker Toast competition was conducted by State Ritual Chairman, Ken Priesner of Ogallala Lodge No. 1760. There were 9 entries in each event except for the Jolly Corker Toast where there was only one entry. Results are as follows: PERs Larry Bratt and Larry Schwindt tied, Flag Tribute, PER Dean Shafer, Grand Island No. 604, 11 O'clock Toast and PER Stephen Wirth, won the Jolly Corker Toast. Presenting the Flag Tribute plaque to Larry and Larry from Lincoln Lodge No. 80 is Rituals Vice Chairman, PER Richard Todd. Since this was the first year of competition for the Jolly Corker Toast, there was no plaque available. However, PER Wirth will have bragging rights for a least a year.

Knight's Tales

I have been blessed to have a job where I get to see a lot of these United States. I do believe that this is the best time of the year to see our country sides; the vivid colors that one can enjoy. I can't but think of the Flag of the United States and the men and women that have defended us. We belong to a truly American Organization. When our Exalted Ruler states during an initiation, or during our Flag Ceremony about the beauty of our Flag, that "no Flag which can compare with it in beauty. There is no such red in budding rose, in falling leaf or sparkling wine; no such white in April blossom, in crescent moon or mountain snow; no such blue in woman's eye, in ocean's depth or heaven's dome; and no such pageantry of clustering stars and streaming light in all the spectrum of the sea and sky'. When our flag is blowing in the wind and in the backdrop you can see vivid green fields, or the deep hue of the skies, it should make you be ever minded about all the gifts we have.

Flag Day is celebrated on June 14. It commemorates the adoption of the flag of the United States, which happened on June 14, 1777, by resolution of the Second Continental Congress. Both President Wilson, in 1916, and President Coolidge, in 1927, issued proclamations asking for June 14 to be observed as the National Flag Day. But it wasn't until August 3, 1949, that Congress approved the national observance, and President Harry Truman signed it into law.

Did you know that the young woman by the name of Miss Margaret Young, cut the stars for the flag that flew over Fort McHenry, on September 14, 1814? This flag inspired Francis Scott Key to write what was to become our national anthem, "The Star-Spangled Banner". Miss Young was the mother of Henry Sanderson, the Grand Exalted Ruler of the Order of Elks in 1884.

The President who signed Flag Day into Law was an ELK. So what this all have to do with Brotherly Love? Well Charity, Justice, Brotherly Love, and Fidelity are the cardinal principles of our Order and they are exemplified in all of our services. By them, we teach love of country and of our countrymen and loyalty to our American way of life. To be an Elk is to be an American citizen who lives for their country and is ready to die for it.

Please remember the words of Theodore Roosevelt: "This country will not be a good place for any of us to live in unless we make it a good place for all of us to live in."


