An Update From Your Scholarship Committee

Please take note of the many scholarship opportunities available to not only members of the Elks, but also to all high school seniors. The national Most Valuable Student (MVS) scholarship competition will award 500 deserving high school seniors a total of \$2,440,000 in scholarships in 2017. The applications are now available online. Please spread the news to any deserving high school senior you know - the applications are due November 30, 2016. ENF also offers Legacy scholarships and Emergency Educational Grants, available only to children of Elks members.

The Nebraska State Elks Association (NSEA) sponsors several scholarships. Some are open to any high school senior, and some are exclusively available to members of Nebraska Elks Lodges. We particularly want to mention the new McQuillan Marauders Scholarship, which is open to any high school senior who is a child or grandchild of an elected or appointed and installed officer of an active Nebraska lodge. This \$1000 scholarship may be used at any post-high school learning institution. Please be aware, there are different application deadlines for each scholarship, which may be found on the NSEA webpage.

And last, but certainly not least, are our own Lodge scholarships. The Lodge awarded and paid nearly \$50,000 in scholarships in 2016, and we will again offer these great opportunities to local area high school seniors, as well as our Legacy awards, which are only for children or grandchildren of Lodge members.

For those of you who can remember, our pub was somewhat outdated at our current location. With Harold's help financially, as well as overseeing the bar's reconstruction, the Jolly Corker Pub was changed into what it is today. In addition, Harold purchased 150 chairs which we have used for dinners and lodge functions since 2011. Besides contributing locally to improve our facility, he also became a Permanent Benefactor with the Elks National Foundation in 2011. Though Harold could be a little rough around the edges from time to time, his knowledge of the Elk By-Laws and procedures helped earn him Elk of the Year in 2008-2009. Harold (93) passed on July 11th of this year and a graveside service with Naval Military Honors was held the morning of July 29th at Lincoln Memorial Park. Harold and wife Elaine (married 53 years) were buried next to their longtime friend, Harry Hoffman (Betty) who was a very active member and trustee of our lodge. Family, friends, and local Elks lodge members were in attendance. 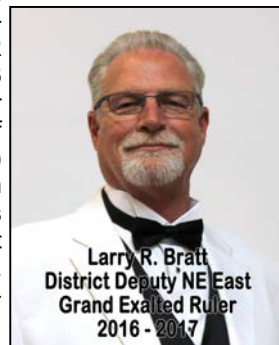

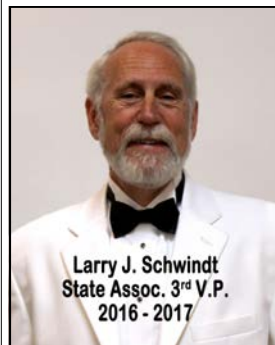
Congrats to PER Larry Bratt

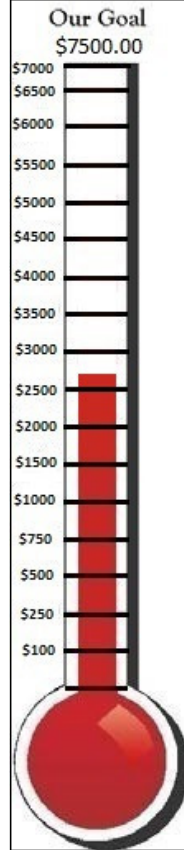
