

When I think of Christmas, I cannot help to think of Brotherly Love and the legend of Santa Claus, one of the benefactors of December. Santa Claus can be traced back hundreds of years to a monk, born in Modern-day Turkey around 280 A.D. His name was Nicholas. He was much admired for his piety and kindness. It is said that he gave away all his inherited wealth and traveled the countryside helping the poor and sick.

Over the course of many years, Nicholas's popularity spread and he became known as the protector of children and sailors. By the Renaissance period, (Saint) Nicholas was the most popular saint in Europe. Even after the Protestant Reformation, when the veneration of saints began to be discouraged, St. Nicholas maintained a positive reputation, especially in Holland. He made his first inroads into American popular culture towards the end of the 18th century. In 1822, Clement Clarke Moore, an Episcopal minister, wrote a long Christmas poem for his three daughters entitled "An Account of a Visit from St. Nicholas". Moore's poem, which he was initially hesitant to publish due to the frivolous nature of its subject, is largely responsible for our modern image of Santa Claus as a "right jolly old elf" with a portly figure and the supernatural ability to ascend a chimney with a mere nod of his head!

Santa Claus is a symbol, you are the key. Brotherly Love is a reason. It costs nothing to share, it's free to give. Remember these dates: Thursday, December 22, we host the 109th Elks Children's Christmas Party; Friday, December 16, Christmas Party at the Lodge, and Saturday, December 17th is Hoop Shoot. 
