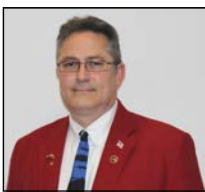
Knights' Tales

As one person put it "Justice is a noun meaning the quality of conforming to principles of reason, to generally accepted standards of right and wrong, and to the stated terms of laws, rules, agreements, etc., rightfulness or lawfulness."

This month, April, can in a number of ways, be referred to as the Justice Month. One of our Founding Fathers, an author, inventor, writer, scholar, and President was born. Thomas Jefferson. He was a lawyer and served in local government as a magistrate, county lieutenant, and member of the House of Burgesses in his early professional life. As a member of the Continental Congress, he was chosen in 1776 to draft the Declaration of Independence, which has been regarded ever since as a charter of American and universal liberties. The document proclaims that all men are equal in rights, regardless of birth, wealth, or status, and that the government is the servant, not the master, of the people. He also authored the Virginia Statute for Religious Freedom began simply as Bill No. 82, "A Bill For establishing religious freedom." As President, he helped to procure a piece of land from the French known as the Louisiana Territory and in 1803 the hiring of two inspiring explorers, Lewis and Clark, to investigate the area where we call home today.

As we begin our new year, let's offer a helping hand to each other. When we witness injustices, let's try to make it right. We as Elks can and will make a difference in the lives of others by being example setters. Lets be the beacon that others can follow. See you around the Lodge!

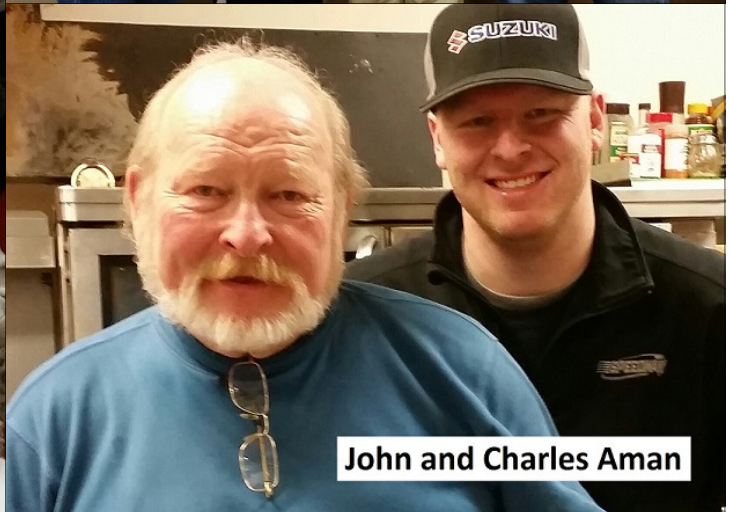

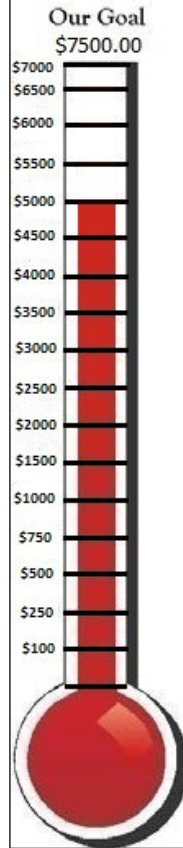
