The Month of May is jam packed with plenty of things for all of us in Lodge #80 to be aware of!

Let's start with National Youth Week, which is May 1-7. It is a week dedicated to the celebration of youth and their active participation in their community. "Whether it is recreation, drama, sport, scouting, civic engagement, art, volunteerism or leadership, every day young people are involved in meaningful activities during their free time."

Also in May, we honor our mothers. The earliest history of Mother's Day dates back to the ancient annual spring festival the Greeks dedicated to maternal goddesses. The Greeks used the occasion to honor Rhea, wife of Cronus and the mother of many deities of Greek mythology.

A man that was well connected to our organization, President Woodrow Wilson on May 8, 1914 signed a Joint Resolution designating the second Sunday in May as Mother's Day. This Joint Resolution was brought about by the hard work of one Anna Jarvis who is recognized as the Founder of Mother's Day in US.

May also brings two other important holidays to honor our military and veterans.

On May 20, we celebrate Armed Forces Day. President Harry S. Truman, a member of the Kansas City, MO Lodge No. 26 led the effort to establish a single holiday for citizens to come together and thank our military members for their patriotic service in support of our country. On August 31, 1949, Secretary of Defense Louis Johnson announced the creation of an Armed Forces Day to replace separate Army, Navy, Marine Corps, and Air Force Days.

Finally, on May 29, our Order and the Nation observe Memorial Day. Memorial Day was borne out of the Civil War and a desire to honor our dead. It was officially proclaimed on May 5, 1868 by General John Logan, national commander of the Grand Army of the Republic, in his General Order No. 11. "The 30th of May, 1868, is designated for the purpose of strewing with flowers, or otherwise decorating the graves of comrades who died in defense of their country during the late rebellion, and whose bodies now lie in almost every city, village, and hamlet churchyard in the land," he proclaimed. The date of Decoration Day, as he called it, was chosen because it wasn't the anniversary of any particular battle.

In 1968, the Uniform Holidays Bill was passed as part of a move to use federal holidays to create three-day weekends. This meant that from 1971 onward, the Memorial Day holiday has been officially observed on the last Monday in May. However, it took a longer period for all American states to recognize the new date. In the words of the late President Ronald Reagan, "Today is the day we put aside to remember fallen heroes and to pray that no heroes will ever have to die for us again. It's a day of thanks for the valor of others, a day to remember the splendor of America and those of her children who rest in this cemetery and others. It's a day to be with the family and remember."

We have a lot to be thankful for this May!

Installation of Officers, 2017 – 2018


