Ritual News Update

After a whirlwind of practices, travel, and competition, your representative for the state of Nebraska's Ritual Team was successful once again. Lincoln Lodge No. 80 was one of 24 teams competing for the right to make the Final Four and ultimately the title of National Champions.

The first and second place teams in the Eastern Division were Best in the East, Tallahassee, Florida (94.8911) and last year's National Champion Bridgeport, Pennsylvania (94.1169). The first and second place teams in the Western Division were Best in the West, Lincoln, Nebraska (95.2491) and Carlsbad, New Mexico (94.7321).

The Final Four was set for the afternoon of Monday, July 17th. The winners and Final Four scores were announced on Tuesday morning at the Grand Lodge Session. 4th Place, Pennsylvania (90.5076), 3rd Place, New Mexico (94.4389), 2nd Place, Nebraska (94.4778) and 1st Place, Florida (94.7978).

So after the air cleared, Lincoln Lodge No. 80 finished Best in the West and finished 2nd nationally. We also had three All Americans; Esteemed Leading Knight Laurie Montag, Chaplain Larry Schwindt and Coach Stephen Wirth. Thank you to all Elk members, families, and friends for your continued support of Ritual in Lincoln as well as across the great state of Nebraska.

I would like to again thank our lodge for sending us to Reno for the 153 National Convention. Your Ritual team tried very hard to bring home the trophy, but we came up just a bit short. My congratulations go out to our coaches Stephen and Doug and the All Americans from our team Larry S. and our ER Laurie as well as the rest of our officers and Candidate.

This year's contest was won by Tallahassee, FL. My congratulations to them for a job well done! The National Convention was a great place to meet other Elks as well as learn about upcoming events. The convention was exciting to be a part of. I listened to two wonderful speeches by our two top scholars Zoi Urban and Colin Norick. What inspiring youths! I witnessed our state President James Nisle proudly presenting our state flag at the opening of the convention.

I listened to a very eye-opening speech by Chuck Rosenberg the acting administrator of the Drug Enforcement Administration in Washington D.C. He not only thanked the Elks and the Drug Awareness Program for all of their support and assistance in the DEA 360 Initiative, but also to thanked the members for all the support and educational material provided to the DEA by the Elks' Drug Awareness Program.

In His presentation, Rosenberg pointed out that "More than 59,000 people die a year of drug overdoses, and it's going to get worse." He noted that while heroin addiction is already an epidemic in the country, a synthetic opioid called fentanyl is fifty times as bad and is becoming increasingly popular. I attended the Drug Awareness Program breakout session and was given a "schooling". I will be talking about what we can do in future articles, but WOW we can be of help in our community by doing simple things. So please spread the word and mark your calendars. The Drug Enforcement Administration (DEA) has scheduled another National Prescription Drug Take-Back Day, which will take place on Saturday, October 28, 2017. This is a great opportunity for those who missed the previous events, or who have subsequently accumulated unwanted, unused, prescription drugs, to safely dispose of those medications. I will let you know where the sites will next month.

We elected Malcolm J. McPherson, Jr., of the Lyndhurst, New Jersey Lodge as Grand Exalted Ruler for 2017-18. I can't wait to shake his hand again at our state Convention. He was nominated by his daughter Mallory.

Now please remember that the month of September signals the end of summer, the beginning of autumn, and the start of Husker Football. Don't forget if you want to do some work within the stadium, we are looking for you!

September comes from the Latin root septem-, meaning "seven," because in the original Roman republican calendar September was the seventh month of the year rather than the ninth. The Roman calendar was only ten months long and included the following months - Martius, Aprilis, Maius, Junius, Quintilis, Sextilis, September, October, November, and December. The last six months were assigned names according to their ordinal numbers—Quintilis is the fifth month, Sextilis is the sixth month, and so on.

It wasn't until 45 BC, when Julius Caesar introduced the Julian calendar (named after Caesar, himself), that the year grew to include two more months, January and February. Quintilis and Sextilis were later renamed to July and August in honor of Julius Caesar and Augustus Caesar, but despite repeated attempts to change them, the names for September, October, November, and December not only stuck, but spread to other languages as well.

The strangeness of calling the ninth month "Seventh Month" didn't seem to bother Old English speakers. September came into Old English from Old French, replacing the Old English forms, Hāligmōnāð and Hærfestmōnāð, which mean "harvest month" in Modern English.

If Nebraskans had their way we would call September "Huskertember"...

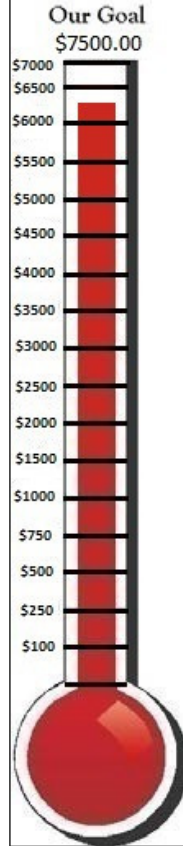
