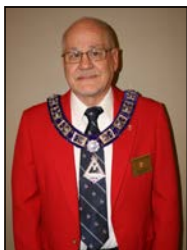
Greetings!

It's very hard to imagine that in 2015 over 52,000 people died in the US from drug overdose and that 2/3 of these people (34,623 the number of people who live in the city of Kearney), were due to opioids including Fentanyl.

In case you did not realize it, Fentanyl is a powerful narcotic painkiller that is used to treat severe pain. It is an opioid, meaning that it is a fully synthetic (man-made) drug based on the opiate group of drugs derived from the Opium poppy such as Morphine and Heroin. Because of its potency (roughly 100 times stronger than morphine) it is generally only used in the management of severe pain and as a hospital analgesic.

Fentanyl is so potent that an amount the size of three grains of sugar is lethal to an adult. This drug was first synthesized in the 1960s by Janssen Pharmaceuticals, and was initially used as a general anesthetic during surgery. Its only acceptable, "on-label" use is for reduction of severe pain in cancer sufferers. Today, the drug has two main sources: the prescription drug industry, and Mexican drug cartels.

In the middle of September, the DEA seized enough Fentanyl to kill 32M people in a *single* NYC bust: prosecutors estimating that the drugs are worth a street value of \$30 million. If that doesn't get your attention, this should: the DEA has issued a public warning to the public and law enforcement nationwide about the health and safety risks of carfentanil. Carfentanil is a synthetic opioid that is 10,000 times more potent than morphine and 100 times more potent than fentanyl, which itself is 50 times more potent than heroin. DEA, local law enforcement, and first responders have recently seen the presence of carfentanil, which has been linked to a significant number of overdose deaths in various parts of the country. Improper handling of carfentanil, as well as fentanyl and other fentanyl-related compounds, has deadly consequences.

As we have all come to like this tenth month of the year, October, did you realize that in the Julian and Gregorian Calendars it is the sixth month to have the length of 31 days. The eighth month in the old Roman calendar, October retained its name (from the Latin word octo meaning "eight") after January and February were inserted into the calendar that had originally been created by the Romans.

In Ancient Rome, the Mundus Patet were stones used to bring about rain (or snow! Bad word, I know) and to cover the opening to Hades, the abode of the dead. Three times a year, August 24, October 5, and November 8, the stones were rolled aside, and a food offering was placed in the hole as a gift to the underworld.

This month is commonly associated with the season of autumn in the Northern hemisphere and spring in the Southern hemisphere, where it is the seasonal equivalent to April in the Northern hemisphere and vice versa.

Remember October 28, 2017, is National Prescription Drug Take Back Day. The goal of this day is to provide a safe, convenient, and responsible means of disposing of prescription drugs, while also educating the general public about the potential for abuse and medication. Look around our lodge and in the paper for sites to take your unwanted drugs to.

Be safe, have fun, volunteer for something, and please, if you are able, contribute to the Elks Disaster Relief Programs, Inc.

2017 Grand Lodge Convention

The 153rd Grand Lodge Convention kicked off on Sunday, July 16, 2017 in Reno, Nevada with the Opening Ceremonies. We heard from the Hoop Shoot Getty Powell Award winner Sophie Phillips of New York, and we heard from the top Elks scholars (recipients of the \$50,000 scholarships), Colin Norick of Kalispell, MT and Zoi Urban of Santa Maria, CA. Both had inspiring stories, but we found Colin's story of triumph over his autism to be particularly moving.

Aside from the general meetings, much was learned in the workshops attended by your officers. As Elks celebrate 150 years of service this year, much information was disseminated in special workshops. Esteemed Leading Knight Troy Pedersen is leading up our 150 Committee and will have more on what our lodge has planned to observe this milestone. One of the observances is happening on Elks.org with the Elks History Project. If you have photographs or documents that would be of historical interest, please share them with any officer for possible submission to the site. Also, there are many historical items already available for viewing on the website, so log in if you would like to peruse them.

Convention Newsletters reporting on items of special interest may be found in the Elks.org membership area under "National Convention" in the left menu. If you have not established a login, you will need your membership number to do so. Much interesting information is available there.

We voted on many resolutions, 19 to be exact. Many were "housekeeping" items, but a few were particularly interesting. The assembly voted to remove the option of the shortened initiation from the Grand Lodge statutes, so the long form will now be the only option for initiation. The assembly also resoundingly confirmed the longstanding statute that consumption or possession of alcohol at any Lodge meeting is prohibited. If you are interested in reviewing the 2017 Statutory Amendments, please let me or Lodge Secretary Jerry Wilson know.

The last order of business was the installation of the 2017-2018 Grand Lodge officers, during which our new Grand Exalted Ruler, Malcolm McPherson, Jr., was installed. Those of us who attended the Nebraska State Elks Association Fall Conference the last weekend in August were able to meet and become acquainted with GER McPherson and First Lady Pat. They are truly lovely people, hailing from Lyndhurst, NJ.

Thank you for the opportunity to represent Lincoln Lodge #80 in Reno. Next year's Grand Lodge will be held in San Antonio, and promises to be special due to the 150 celebration – plan to attend, if you are able!

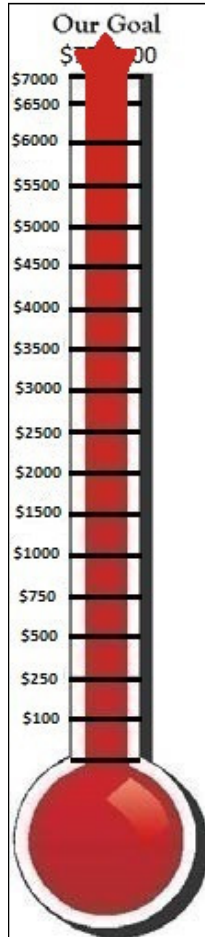
