Ah February! A month that is the shortest of the year, but in reality it feels like the longest. Punxsutawney Phil hopefully won't see his shadow on the second. It's Elmo's (yes Elmo's!) birthday month. Valentine's Day, Presidents Day. Mardi Gras, and the birth of our order on the 16th.

First a little history of our calendar. The original Roman calendar only had ten months. In the 700s BC, the second king of Rome, Numa Pompilius, added January and February to the end of the calendar in order to conform to how long it actually takes the Earth to go around the Sun. At that time, March 1 became New Years' Day. Later, in 153 BC, the beginning of the year was moved to January 1. The two new months were both originally 28 days long. It is lost to history why January acquired more days, though there are various unverifiable hypotheses.

The word February comes from the Roman festival of purification called Februa where people were ritually washed. There is a Roman god called Februas, but he is named after the festival, not the other way around. The Japanese have a term, kenzoku, which translated literally means "family." The connotation suggests a bond between people who've made a similar commitment and who possibly therefore share a similar destiny. It implies the presence of the deepest connection of friendship. February allows one to ponder what draws us together. Could it be common interest? Common Values? History? A commitment to happiness?

Whatever the case, as Elks we share a sense of unity, support, belief, commitment, and volunteerism. A spirit of friendship. As our mission statement, we inculcate the principles of Charity, Justice, Brotherly Love, and Fidelity.
