Knight's Tales

As fellow Elks, I would like to remind you that: We are...A fraternal order with nearly a million members and a 150-year history. We belong to a network of nearly 2000 lodges in communities all over the country and we are a generous charitable foundation that each year gives millions in scholarships, an inspiration to youth, a friend to veterans and more.

Our Mission is to inculcate (meaning to teach [someone] an attitude, idea, or habit by persistent instruction) the principles (which is the fundamental truth or proposition that serves as the foundation for a system of belief or behavior or for a chain of reasoning.) of Charity (meaning the voluntary giving of help, to those in need), Justice (which is the principle or ideal of just dealing or right action), Brotherly Love (the natural affection toward the greater community of fellow Citizens, regardless of their color of skin or country of origin), and Fidelity (strict observance of promises, duties because of loyalty to our country) to recognize a belief in God;(the one Supreme Being, the creator and ruler of the universe) to promote the welfare and enhance the happiness of its Members; to quicken (stir up, rouse, or stimulate) the spirit (the principle of conscious life; of American patriotism; to cultivate (to promote or improve the growth of) good fellowship; to perpetuate itself as a fraternal organization, and to provide for its government the supreme authority of a state or nation, taken as representing the whole), the Benevolent (characterized by or expressing goodwill or kindly feelings) and Protective (providing shelter) Order of Elks of the United States of America will serve the people and communities through benevolent programs, demonstrating that Elks Care and Elks Share.

We are a volunteer-based organization. Simply meaning that you can actively take on a task, responsibility, or project by your own accord without needing to be assigned, ordered, or told to do so. Often a volunteer is not paid for the work that they provide.

By volunteering, we now are entering a generally considered altruistic (unselfishly concerned for or devoted to the welfare of others) activity where an individual or group provides services for no financial or social gain "to benefit another person, group or organization". Volunteering is also renowned for skill development and is often intended to promote goodness or to improve human quality of life. Volunteering may have positive benefits for the volunteer as well as for the person or community served. It is also intended to make contacts for possible employment. There are many things that you can do to help our lodge, or even start a project by volunteering.

Several months ago, a member of our lodge (not saying it was Lu) and I were talking and the word "Elkish" was tossed about. Well Elkish can mean any number of things, from not talking bad about someone or a group, to feeling good about something participated in.

Lodge 80 – your Lodge is Elkish - volunteer, step in, step up, and participate in any number of lodge activities. Like our Drug Awareness Program, did you realize that through this program kids learn about healthy choices by participating in fun, engaging opportunities. The Elks Drug Awareness Program has produced a series of comic books focusing on peer pressure and bullying to helping kids make appropriate decisions. As an example, in 2016 the University of Michigan released findings from the Monitoring the Future Survey, a national survey of students in the 8th, 10th, and 12th grade. The results showed that: The majority of students (two out of three) said they drank alcohol (more than just a few sips) by the end of high school. About 26 percent of them did so by 8th grade. Nearly half of 12th graders and one in nine 8th graders reported being drunk at least once in their life. Almost half of 12th graders and nearly one third of 10th graders said they had used marijuana. Today, drugs cause a death in the United States every 13 minutes.

Now to put a cap on that bottle, more people die from accidental drug overdose in the United States each year than in motor vehicle accidents — drugs and alcohol can be a real problem for our youth.

I bet you did not hear about that one. Well I have taken enough of your time. Remember to be "Elkish"!
