This year convention will cover a lot of new and exciting ideas and programs which we will all be sharing and trying to use within the 4 walls of our lodge. Business Meeting (We get to see Brad Norton carrying the State Flag), and National Drug Awareness Program Seminar Tuesday, July 3, 2018, 1:30 PM - 3:30 PM . You can follow the activities of the convention on Elks.org.

Today there are mixed feelings by adults in the United States pertaining to the use of drugs in our society. As adults in the United States of America, you are guaranteed certain freedoms granted by the constitution and laws passed by congress both on the Federal Level and State levels. The purpose of Our drug awareness program is to promote constructive and cooperative approaches to the prevention of the use of illicit substances by the youth of the United States of America. This will be accomplished through education of students and parents, and by assisting scholastic institutions with programs and materials.

Regardless of who we are, we can all say that we do certain things to reduce the pains we have. We live in a very stressful society, from the everyday news, to our jobs, and to rid ourselves of stress or to do something to help us rid ourselves of boredom we have we do feel we need to do something to reduce this feeling. So, we turn to another thing to help us.

We need to have educational materials available for all - take for example the drug Fentanyl—a popular mood-modifying, recreational opioid that can be taken on its own or laced into other drugs. It has gained a reputation as the Grim Reaper of illicit drugs. The number of deaths (and near deaths) originating with fentanyl use is shocking. Take for example - Cook County, Ill., (Chicago) recorded a 2,700 percent increase in fatal fentanyl-related overdoses, jumping from 20 in 2014 to 562 in 2016. Orange County, Fla., (Orlando) saw its 34 fatal fentanyl overdoses in 2014 triple to 105 in 2016. And Franklin County, Ohio, (Columbus) went from 13 such overdoses to 111 in 2016.

Law enforcement and public health officials say they are alarmed by the rate at which fentanyl has infiltrated the illicit drug market and how it is transforming the face of the drug crisis, which resulted in 60,000 fatal overdoses in 2016, more than half of which were from opioids.

We as adults must initiate a serious discussion with our children and teens about fentanyl and other drug use. In this case, talk is the primary preventive. Many parents avoid a direct discussion with their kids about drug use because they feel that they have a limited knowledge base and anticipate that they will not be taken seriously. Unfortunately, we (adults and children tend to have a superficial knowledge of drugs).

I know today that most kids probably know more about drugs than I did when I was their age. But the times don't change, we are still governed by the same old principle of encouraged to experiment by their friends, classmates, and older acquaintances. Kids still feel insecure about their social status or lack self-confidence, people are still more tempted to experiment with drugs when pressed by their peers.

Summer is a great time to be together as families and visits with friends and relatives. Be careful out there this year. Please keep our lodge in your plans and remember there are over 2000 lodges across these United States so when traveling,
