A Note from our E.R.

The Covid-19 pandemic has truly disrupted and changed our lives in unprecedented ways. Places we used to visit or frequent have changed as we have. We all need to adjust to the new norm.

If you look around Lincoln, you can see the economic impact that we are currently experiencing. For the first time in my life, I was left with a very unsettling feeling going to the grocery store and discovering shelves that had no product on them or "Please limit yourself to 1" signs.

Even our lodge is struggling to make ends meet. We were given an increase in our property valuation, we were closed for several months, we did not have meals or events scheduled. Revenue that used to flow was nonexistent. We had to do something. Since we had very limited resources coming in, we had to find ways to reduce costs. One way was to ask the County Tax commissioners to grant us a tax exemption, I am very sure that you have heard the term Quid Pro Quo (this for that). So in exchange for a considerable savings (to all of us), we had to give up some hours of operation. We did not have to lay off any current employees, we simply did not replace, again saving us a large chunk of money. We changed supply companies, soon cable companies, pest control companies, and other things just to name a few.

We are making these changes to stay with our financial constraints and to be good Stewards of your money.

Now, if you are one of the Lodges that rely on your accountant to be doing this for you, then put someone in charge to have a conversation with your accountant and report back to the Lodge or your accountant.

So where is it good to give 100%? Membership! This year's GER Class should be based on the motto, Creating Momentum for the Future of Elkdom. Get out there and recruit Members. But, recruit with the following things in mind:

- 1) The future of Elkdom relies on the age of our Members.
- 2) The future of Elkdom relies on future leaders.
- 3) The future of Elkdom relies on volunteers.
- 4) The future of Elkdom is dependent on us to create new and future Members. Give 100% to the best GER Class ever.

Another place to give 100%: ENF. This is ENF Month and with the raise in the amount of my goal to \$4.80, this is a great time to give 100%. How about giving 100% more than you did last year? This is the year to have an event for ENF in order to recruit Members to become a part of the Fidelity Club. This is a club where a monthly donation is given to ENF. See how many Members are in your Lodge and then plan on doubling it—That is giving 100%.

This is the time for the Americanism Essay Contest. This year my goal is to get the Elks Magazine to publish the two winning essays. I've had many years of pressure from a Member in my state and I hope to achieve it for him. The student that writes it deserves the recognition, and we deserve to be able to read the winners.

Don't forget that Red Ribbon week is October 23-31. And now is the time to prepare for all of your veterans activities for the month of November. Lastly, our Hoop Shoot programs should now be ramping up and getting prepared.

To me our Flag is a symbol of freedom and liberty to which no one people in the world have ever known. I know in my lifetime our flag has endured so much confusion and discourse it is amazing that our leaders haven't proposed something new.

On July 4, 1776, the Continental Congress passed a resolution authorizing a committee to develop a seal for the country. The committee was instructed to draw up a seal that reflected the Founding Fathers' beliefs and values, as well as the sovereignty of the new nation. Red, white and blue (Continental Colors) were chosen, and the Great Seal was officially adopted on June 20, 1782. But why the colors? The choosing of these specific colors can be directly attributed to the (Continental Colors) Grand Union flag and later on that year the Betsy Ross flag.

The story continues with a Mr. Charles Thomson, who was Secretary of the Continental Congress, he explained the significance to Congress when he presented the seal and flag to Congress. "The colors," Thomson said at the time, "are those used in the flag of the United States of America. White signifies purity and innocence. Red, hardiness & valor, and Blue... signifies vigilance, perseverance & justice."

Our Flag along with a poem made into a song made its sporting-event debut in September 1918 debut during that year's World Series game between the Chicago Cubs and Boston Red Sox. Remember that WWI was still being fought and a cloud of violence hung over Chicago's Comiskey Park, as a bomb had torn apart the Chicago Federal Building just the day before. During the seventh-inning stretch, a military band on hand struck up "The Star-Spangled Banner," and in a moving spectacle, players and fans alike fell silent and saluted the flag. The practice soon spread across major league baseball, and into other sports, and eventually became a widely accepted pregame tradition.

Our National anthem "The Star-Spangled Banner" was a poem written by Francis Scott Key. He wrote the poem during the bombardment of Fort McHenry on September 13, 1814. Once again, our flag was the inspiration for the poem. At first, "The Star-Spangled Banner" trailed "Yankee Doodle" (which was written in 1755 by British Army surgeon Dr. Richard Shuckburgh) and "Hail Columbia" (written in 1789 by a German Philip (Pfeil). But during and immediately after the Civil War, Key's song gained a deeper meaning, as the American flag became an increasingly powerful symbol of national unity.

By the 1890s, the U.S military had adopted the song for ceremonial purposes, playing it to accompany the raising and lowering of the colors. In 1916, President Woodrow Wilson signed an executive order designating it "the national anthem of the United States." Finally, in 1931—more than 100 years after it was composed—Congress passed a measure declaring "The Star-Spangled Banner" as the official national anthem.
