Knight's Tales

This seeming furor over such a thing as fighting has to do with the nature of contesting an issue. When two or more persons evidence an item of contention, and there does not seem to be a more pleasant way to resolve, what is left but to "have at it???"

First, for justice to be served, it has to be courted with respect and intentionality. If justice is righteous and good-intentioned, then all other considerations for fair play must be pursued so that all persons involved with any dispute may find their ends well met.

Second, there must be a legitimate framework, such as a constitution and bylaws, that set forth what dictates a violation of organizational rules and/or obligations. Officers of such organizations are then charged with investigating, scrutinizing, and executing judgment upon any and all violations and obligations.

Third, any tale of misappropriation of rules and regulations within an organization should be reviewed with caution and alertness as to its origin and standing within the organization. Such violations and related wrongful actions must be accorded just proceedings in order that it serve to educate the majority on how their members are treated.

Fighting is as human an event as celebrating one's birthday, or attending a wedding. It's natural, sometimes informative (e.g., displaying strategies and methods), and nearly always painful to endure. Fighting may be, of course, mental, as with court cases or letters to the editor. Fighting may also be physical, as with swords in the Medieval era.

But let's strive to keep the peace, no matter the failed obligation or rules broken. Harmony, compassion, and justice reign supreme to serve the organization, thus bolstering the community that the organization serves.

DO YOU KNOW ABOUT SCHOLARSHIPS?

Lodge 80 offers 28 academic scholarships and 2 renewable teaching scholarships that are available to all Lincoln-area high school seniors. We also offer 6 legacy scholarships exclusively available to the children or grandchildren of members of Lodge 80 who have been members for at least 5 years. In addition, we award 6 scholarships to the top 3 males and 3 females who applied for the MVS scholarships through Lodge 80. Altogether, Lodge 80 funds and administers 48 scholarships each year, ranging in value from \$800 to \$2,250 and totaling over \$56,000! These funds are provided through endowments managed by Lincoln Elks Lodge 80 Charitable Fund, Inc., and the Lodge adds another \$600 per scholarship with the help of the Smith Fund.

Applications for all lodge scholarships are only available online at http://e80.elks80.org/scholarship.php. The general and teaching scholarships are available only to high school seniors living in Lincoln and surrounding areas (using the home zip code in the Lodge Locator at elks.org - Lincoln 80 must be listed as "A" in the results). Legacy scholarships are available to students under the age of 25 (please see qualifications on the Legacy webpage). THE IN-OUR-HANDS DUE DATE FOR ALL APPLICATIONS AND REQUIRED SUBMISSIONS IS 5PM, JANUARY 31, 2021.






