We now know that Grand Lodge will be mailing the renewal dues billings on February 4, so you should look for them before Valentine's Day. You will also have the option to pay your dues via debit or credit card at the website referenced on the statement (we no longer have the capability of paying dues on elks80.org). As always, we can set up an automatic withdrawal from your checking or savings account each month to pay your next year's dues, but you will need to pay the current year's dues in full.

Remember – the due date for the year's dues is April 1, 2021. On April 2, you are considered delinquent, and not a member in good standing, and you must be a member in good standing to enjoy the benefits of Lodge membership. Also, remember all the good things our Lodge does – and will hopefully be able to do again this year. Your dues and participation help to fund all the good work we do for the children and veterans in our community.




