

You may have heard the unusual claim that Bill Gates is using the Covid-19 vaccine to implant microchips in everyone so he can track where they go. There is a child's game called Chinese whispers or telephone. Players form a line or circle, and the first player comes up with a message and whispers it to the ear of the second person in the line. The second player repeats the message to the third player, and so on. When the last player is reached, they announce the message they heard to the entire group. The first person then compares the original message with the final version.

Although the objective is to pass around the message without it becoming garbled, 99 out of 100 tries it usually ends up happening. Errors typically accumulate in the retellings, so the statement announced by the last player differs significantly from that of the first player, usually with amusing or humorous effect.

The Pew Research Center suggests that 23 percent of U.S. adults have shared the telephone effect, knowingly or unknowingly, with friends and others. That in itself is an amazing statistic.

Today it is very easy to spread misinformation. We have various on-line formats like Facebook, Twitter, What's APP and soft news sites.

How do we stop misinformation? Three words Stop, Reflect, and Verify.

On the flip side if you are not attending your Lodge Meeting, House Meeting, Trustee Meeting or Charitable Funds Meeting you're not verifying. What you are hearing might not be correct. I encourage you to attend, participate and help run your lodge.

A few words regarding Grand Lodge's quarterly member billing service that we are using, which not only saves us money, but keeps your secretary sane(r).

First, it is still possible for you to pay your dues via credit card online. In the bottom right corner of your dues statement, there is a paragraph, "How to Renew." You may make a payment at https://search.revopay.com/elkslodge. At the "Please search your property name" page, type "Lincoln" and select "Lincoln Elks 80." At the login page, select "Make a Quick Payment." Enter your member number on the next page. From there, it's a piece of cake to use either your debit card or a credit card to pay your dues. 15789.

Second, please be aware that if you submitted your dues payment after April 10th, you may still receive a bill around the first week of June. This is due to necessary lag time inherent in the system. If you receive a bill and you have already paid your dues, please accept our thanks and file it in the circular file.

Thirdly, please remember that our lodge year starts on April 1 each year. Once April 1 arrives and you have not yet paid your dues, your membership is NOT in good standing, and you are NOT eligible to take advantage of the lodge facilities until your dues are paid (House Rule #5). PLEASE PAY YOUR DUES EACH YEAR PRIOR TO APRIL 1 and everyone will be happy!

For his Eagle project, Ryder organized a group of Scouts to do landscaping and re-mulching of the commons areas and parking islands at the Northeast YMCA.






