With summer coming to an end, now is our opportunity to offer events that give our Members activities and places to gather. Offer dinners once or twice a week and plan various activities that your membership can support and join. Start using these events to promote your Lodge for prospective Members as well as for contacting delinquent Members. It is never too early to start planning your future events.

National Patriotism week starts on Labor Day and runs through September 12. You still have time to download and have your city's mayor sign a proclamation for National Patriotism Week if you were unable to do so last month.

Exalted Rulers, remember the Grand Exalted Ruler class begins this month and runs through October. Let us make it a good one to continue "Meeting the Challenge." If you have not done so, visit elks.org. Look under the Grand Lodge Activities Committee. Then take advantage of the various forms and certificates you can use through the year to recognize program participants and volunteers. Also, make sure to reach out to your committee chairpersons to ensure they are recording and submitting the information to the Lodge Secretary.

Lodge Secretaries, let this serve as a reminder to begin sending your six-month dues and delinquent notices. If your Lodge has not signed up for the Membership Billing System, check into it on elks.org (Membership Tool Kit, Lodge billing) or contact your Area Membership Chair. The cost savings to your Lodge will be significant. Further, once the notices have been sent, have your Membership and Lapsation Committee contact these individuals. You would be surprised what a little personal contact can accomplish.

The Elks Legacy scholarships also open this month on elks.org. Legacy Awards are available to children and grandchildren of Elks' Members. Check on-line for eligibility requirements. The Elks National Hoop Shoot turns 50 this year and it is also just around the corner. Now is the time to start planning your local contest. If your Lodge is involved with this program, thank you. If it has been awhile since your Lodge participated, now is a good time to start. Start small; choose one school in your area and bring your program back to life. If you need help, contact your District Hoop Shoot Director for assistance.

Finally, this is the time to submit your Lodge website for judging to receive the Grand Lodge 5-Star Award. State Association websites can also be submitted for judging as well. This is a great opportunity to demonstrate what your Lodge is accomplishing as well as advertise your Lodge to your community

We've got to do a better job of getting across that America is freedom -- freedom of speech, freedom of religion, freedom of enterprise. And freedom is special and rare. It's fragile; it needs protection."

I was reading an article from Gallup which stated that American pride has continued its downward trajectory reaching the lowest point in two decades. The new low comes at a time when the U.S. faces public health and economic crises brought on by the coronavirus pandemic and civil unrest.

As Elks, we can show our "Love of Country" by flying our flag. Supporting our Military. Thanking a Police Officer, Firefighter, or Medical Professional. We need to show respect to others. We can have different opinions and talk about them in a civil way.

National Patriotism week starts on Labor Day and runs through September 12. Lets show our neighbors and our city who we as Elks really are.


Filo's reflections...

Several weeks ago, I had the immense pleasure of attending the Elks Scholar Service Trip in Chicago, Illinois. I am extremely thankful for the gracious financial help that was provided to me by the Lincoln Elks Lodge #80. Although I have been to Chicago many times, this experience was particularly meaningful and life changing. I initially wanted to attend this service trip as a chance to meet fellow Elks Scholars. After the 2020 Most Valuable Student Leadership Weekend in Chicago was switched to a virtual format, I saw this service trip opportunity as the perfect chance to finally connect in person to like-minded scholars from across the nation. I landed in Chicago on Tuesday, July 20th, and after navigating my way on the "L" trains in the city, I eventually made my way to the hostel we were staying at. The first day was spent primarily settling in and getting to know one another. A few scholars and I even got to go to the famous Lincoln Park Zoo and eat lunch on the shores of Lake Michigan! As the evening settled in, our Elks Scholar Leader, Grace Roebuck, encouraged us to reflect on our goals for the week. We each went around and told the team what we believed we had to offer and what we needed from the collective.

The next morning, we boarded our bus and headed to our first service site, Humble Design. Humble Design is a non-profit operating in many cities across the United States. Humble Design helps furnish homes for families

that have recently existed homelessness. According to the Humble Design director in Chicago, the rate of people who return to homelessness after getting help furnishing their home is much lower than those without a furnished home. We spent the day at Humble Design assembling furniture, cleaning up the warehouse, creating crafts for the families, and packing the moving truck that was going to furnish a home. Afterwards, we got some Chicago deep dish pizza and explored the city! The next day, we served for another local nonprofit called Care for Friends. At Care for Friends, we prepared food for and served about 50 individuals experiencing homelessness. Shrimp Scampi and Frittata was on the menu! I bonded with one individual who was a fellow saxophone player. We talked about jazz music while he enjoyed his meal. This conversation, albeit simple, was an eye-opening experience for me because we oftentimes forget about the lives, passions, interests, and desires of those experiencing homelessness.

After Care for Friends, we made our way over to the Elks National Headquarters and Memorial. Finally seeing the memorial in person was truly breathtaking! At the headquarters, we packed 150 lunches for another service site and learned all about Elk's history. To wrap up our service trip, we prepared a taco bar at Lincoln Park Community Services for dinner. I truly have never experienced anything like this trip before. As someone who always visited Chicago for fun, this was an incredible opportunity for me to really connect to a different side of the city that is often neglected. Once again, I would like to thank the generosity of Laurie and the entire Lincoln Elks Lodge for the support. I am already looking forward to my next service trip!


