Greetings! I'm loaning my space to Nebraska State Association Secretary Barry Hopkins this month. He has a special message about membership.

A Message from your State Secretary,

You might ask what the heck is Barry Hopkins doing in our Lodge newsletter.



Let me tell you, membership growth in every lodge in the state affects us all

The Nebraska State Elks Association has implemented an incentive program that has been working in Kansas. The structure of the program is the same as theirs, but we have upped the ante. Here is how it works: If your lodge has a growth in membership of plus 1 on March 31st your lodge will be awarded a grant of \$200.00 to be used for charitable work in your community. If you have a plus 1 (or more) the second year your lodge will be awarded \$400.00. For the 3rd consecutive year of plus membership, the dollar amount is \$800.00, the 4th consecutive year is \$1,600.00, and for every consecutive year after that it is \$2,000.00.

Imagine what more you could do in your community with \$2,000.00. Now if you fail to have a plus membership at any time you start back over from the beginning. There are a few strings attached in being awarded these grants. Obviously, there is the plus in membership, another is your lodge needs to meet the Grand Exalted Rulers goal in ENF per capita giving. Most of the lodges in the state have been doing this already. You also should be pitching membership to ENF to your new members. The next two are the responsibilities of your lodge secretary. The annual Charitable report must be submitted to Grand Lodge by April 30th. Also, the Nebraska Elks Association dues must be paid to the State Secretary prior to May 1. The final string, I alluded to in discussing the dollars, the money awarded must be used for charitable programs.

Membership growth is not solely the job of the Exalted Ruler, or the Lodge Secretary, or even the chairman of the membership committee (yes there is a membership committee in every lodge). But it is the job of every Elk in the State of Nebraska. Invite a friend, family member, or someone you just met down to the lodge to let them see what the lodge has to offer them. Tell them about the great things your lodge does for the community. If you don't know what those things are come to a lodge meeting and ask questions, the meeting is not just for the officers, ALL are welcome. Then you tell them how great it would be for them to be an Elk!

I will get off my soap box for now, thank you for taking the time to read this article.




