#### Trustee News...



At the Trustee's meeting we went over the Lodge reports and all is looking good. We went thru the ATM contract for the Lodge gaming and we came up with a few points that we need more information on. We plan to send them our concerns and hopefully will have it in very soon. The next item is

the convection oven - the oven is not working and we had a service company come look at it to diagnose the problem. After going thru the oven, the repairs will be over \$1300 due to age and availability of parts. With that in mind, we are going to look at what a new or used one would cost and then look at all our options on the oven and how to pay for it. More information to come in the near future. We also looked at our entry doors and we feel that it is time to rekey the locks. This hasn't been done for many years and for security reasons this needs to be addressed. It was decided that we will contact Mattice Lock shop and have them perform the work. A motion was made at the Lodge meeting and it was approved to proceed with getting this done. The Lodge was contacted by The Auto Connection and asked to judge entries for a car donation for a needy family or individual. We agreed to do this and it was brought to the floor for the members to approve. - Scott Schrage
