The first year for our new Christmas Giving Project is in the books! I am proud to say that when we asked for help, our members, their spouses and friends were quick to respond. I was overwhelmed by the number of people who volunteered to help with this project. After working with The Malone Community Center, City Impact, and We Can Do This, we compiled lists of families and items the kids wanted and/or needed for Christmas. We then generated shopping lists for each family and scheduled a shopping night. On the shopping night we had 13 Elks and 14 non-Elks come to help. We passed out shopping lists and turned everyone loose. After three hours of shopping, everything was loaded into vehicles and dropped off at my house. All of the items were then sorted into bags for each individual child and later taken to the Lodge to be wrapped. On wrapping night, we had 13 Elks and 16 non-Elks come to help, bringing boxes, tape, wrapping paper, gift bags, tissue paper, bike bags, bows, and ribbon, and in a little over two hours over 300 items were wrapped and bagged for delivery to the three sites for distribution.

All totaled we were able to make Christmas brighter for 59 families with a combined 194 children. This worthwhile and fulfilling endeavor was made possible by the time and energy supplied by the people who volunteered their time and talents to make this new program





such a success. All totaled there were 98 Elk Hours, 314 Elk miles, 105 non-Elk hours, 331 non-Elk miles, plus the Christmas Giving Project Committee added another 118 hours and 116 miles. The generosity and willingness to help with this project reaffirms why the Elks are the foremost charitable organization in the


Good of the Order...
