Speaking of keeping lodge dues down, you might notice that 24/25 dues are \$5.00 higher than 23/24 dues were. This is the result of a Grand Lodge per capita increase that is related to liability insurance. It has nothing to do with the portion of your dues that help to maintain and run our lodge.

January was full of weather-related disruptions in the operations of the lodge. A reminder, it is our policy to follow LPS' determinations for weather closure – if LPS is closed, the Lodge will also be closed.

### Good of the Order...

Teen of the Year awards were discussed. The idea of the cash prize

currently awarded was thought to be ineffective. Ken Cohn suggested that we replace that with Precious Metal, i.e. a Silver ingot valued at approximately \$25. Larry Bratt made a motion to do water bottles, discontinue the cash prize this year, and to look into switching to precious metals and cases for next year. The Food Fort is a non-profit that serves children in the north and northwest areas of the city. They have a bus that they use to take meals to the children in the areas they serve. They also use the bus for homework sessions. The Lodge helped The Food Fort with grant money during the pandemic. The Lodge fielded a request for assistance with their bus, which needed significant repairs and new tires. Randy King worked with the director of the Food Fort and a tire distributor he knew to obtain a great deal on new tires for the bus. At our Jan. 17 lodge meeting, Randy made a motion to use \$1,500 of the remaining Special Request money to purchase and install these tires, and the members present passed it unanimously. Kudos to Randy King for taking the lead on this and helping out these kids!


