Secretary's Corner

The Elks National Foundation (ENF) is the nonprofit arm of the B.P.O. Elks. It is the support of members that keeps ENF well endowed to be in a position to fund the premier scholarship program, the Most Valuable Student Scholarship competition, the ENF Legacy Scholarship program, and the Emergency Grant Scholarship program, all to the tune of nearly \$5M annually. As Elks, we can be very proud of the amount of



funding that we provide to our youth to pursue their educational aspirations. ENF also funds the Hoop Shoot free throw program; the Drug Awareness program; and Elks National Veterans Service Commission programs.

The ENF also funds the Community Investments Program (CIP), which is a grant program established to help local lodges fund special projects in their communities, as well as grants to State Associations to help fund larger state projects. Last year, Lodge #80 applied for and received \$12,000 in CIP grant money to help fund our outreach to veterans via our pantry and funding of the Veteran's Advisory Group, in addition to helping City Impact, Malone Center, and We Can Do This to provide assistance to children of low-income families in our community. ENF's CIP program helps us to be proactive in the Lincoln community, something of which our members can be proud.

Members' support of ENF is important – and support can mean whatever you want it to mean. The Fidelity Club is a method of establishing a monthly automatic donation for as little as \$5. It is possible to include a donation when you pay your dues each year. One-time donations may also be made by check to Elks Lodge #80, designating ENF in the memo line; or they may be made online under the Elks National Foundation tab when you log onto your elks.org member account. Member accounts are easy to set up with your membership number.

All this to say that your annual donation to ENF, in whatever amount you elect, helps the Elks to maintain the moniker of the **B**est **P**eople **O**n Earth by enabling us to be a shining light in our community!





Give to Lincoln Day 2024

Event Overview

Give to Lincoln Day is an event that encourages people to contribute to Lincoln and Lancaster County nonprofit organizations, and is coordinated by Lincoln Community Foundation, in partnership with local nonprofit organizations. Every donation made through Give to Lincoln Day makes a bigger impact, because nonprofits also get a proportional share of \$650,000 in matching funds.

Making a donation

Online donations (the preferred method) can be made with a credit/debit card at www.givetolincoln.com from May 1 starting at 12:00am, through May 30 at 11:59pm. Offline donations (checks) must be written to "Lincoln Community Foundation" with the nonprofit name specified in the memo line, and mailed to the address below (postmarked by May 23):

Is there a minimum / maximum donation?

The minimum donation on www.givetolincoln.com is \$10. There is no maximum donation limit. Household gifts exceeding \$10,000 per nonprofit will be eligible for match fund dollars up to \$10,000, and any amount in excess of \$10,000 will not be eligible for the match fund.

What does all of this mean for the Lincoln Elks Lodge?

The Elks scholarship fund is eligible to receive funds through the Give to Lincoln Day event. This is the seventh year we have participated in this event, and have increased our base scholarship fund each year. If you have ever wanted to give to the scholarship fund, now is the time. All contributions are tax deductible and your donation will be increased by the matching funds through the Lincoln Community Foundation. The Lincoln Elks Lodge makes a huge impact on the community with the scholarships that we give. We should be very proud that we can have an impact on so many young adults in our area. Any contributions that you make to the scholarship fund will help keep this program strong, and will ensure the viability of this program well into the future.
