On May 11th we held our Annual Youth Recognition Ceremonies with over 200 in attendance. At that time we also presented our Most Valuable Student and Jensen Scholarships. The Jensen Scholarship is funded through contributions to the Jack M. Jensen, Sr. Memorial Scholarship Fund. Any Brother wishing to contribute to or establish a Memorial for this fund should contact PER Jack Jensen, Jr.

The Most Valuable Student Scholarships are funded by a combination of local Lodge, State Association and National Foundation funds. Our Elks National Foundation will contribute 1.8 million dollars this year toward scholarships for graduating high school seniors. They are the second largest source for college scholarship funds in the Nation (second only to the Federal Government).

Our National Foundation also provides an additional one-half million dollars each year to fund the post high school educational programs, on a need basis, for the children of any deceased or disabled Elk.

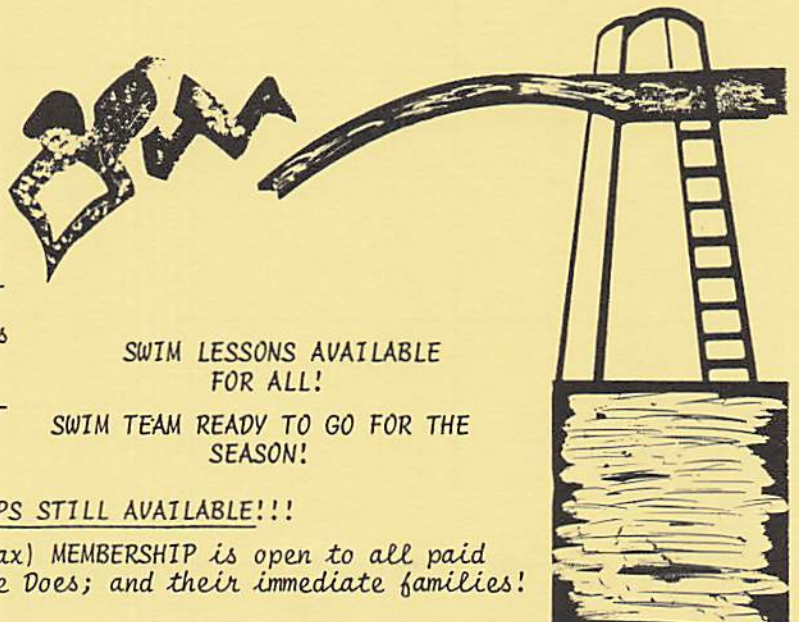

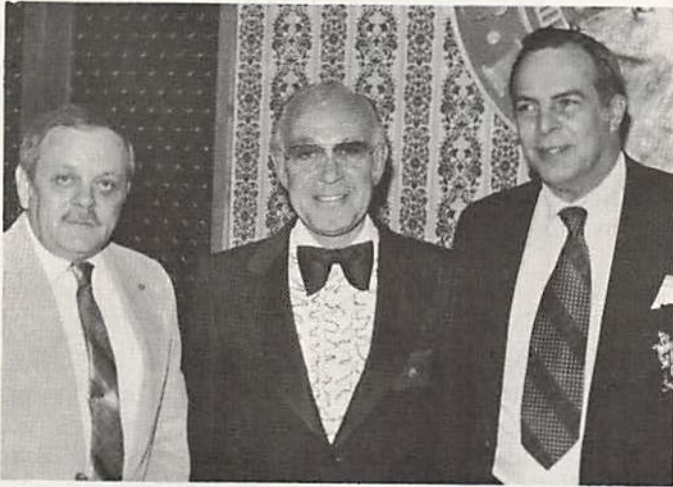



DID YOU KNOW?

On April 29th, we sent a check to the National Headquarters for \$6,165.25 to cover our National Dues. This money pays for such things as your *ELKS* magazine subscription, a contribution to the Elks National Home, and other National operating expenses.

We also sent a check for \$1,792.33 to the State Association as our contribution and assessment for State activities. These combined fees amount to \$4.50 per member.

At the present time, we find that the two-thirds of our brothers who have already paid their dues are carrying the other one-third who have yet to pay. With an enrollment of approximately 2,000 members that means there are over 600 who are currently delinquent, and for whom we have had to advance payment for National and State dues.

Speaking of delinquents — have you seen the ADULT DELINQUENT notice in our entrance? The names of brothers who were delinquent in their dues as of May 15th are posted there as a reminder.
