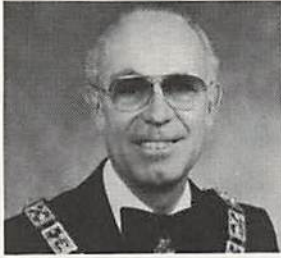

Attending the National Grand Lodge Convention is truly inspiring. As I have gone through the chairs as an officer of Lodge No. 80, I have become more and more aware of the dedication that our local members have toward the goals of our Order. At the Grand Lodge Convention, I was overwhelmed with the realization that this same dedication permeates our entire Order of 1.6 million strong. The results of that dedication and the work of our brothers around the country becomes very evident when you see the enthusiasm and hear the reports of accomplishments from brothers in every corner of this nation. My Brothers, now even more than ever, I am convinced that we truly do belong to the finest Fraternal Order in the world!

Last year, our National Foundation provided 3.6 million dollars for the charitable activities of our order. This year, we have budgeted 5.4 million. The motto of our newly-elected G.E.R., Ken Cantoli, is CHARITY – THE CORNERSTONE OF ELKDOM! His program for this next year will echo that motto.

Last year, 1.9 million youth were involved in Elk activities, not including the Hoopshoot, and 5.2 million dollars was expended by subordinate lodges on youth activities, the largest amount ever spent in a single year. The Hoopshoot alone involved 3.99 million youth, 1,499 graduating seniors received a total of 2.39 million dollars in Elk Scholarships, and 1.5 million dollars was spent on National Service Commission projects that included 44,200 Elk visits to Vets Hospitals.

The list of our achievements and activities goes on and on. I will make a more complete report on the National Convention at our September 7th Lodge meeting. I hope you will all try to attend.

Also at our September 7th meeting, we will have a progress report from our "Future Plans" committee. A special thanks goes to Brother Gary Robinson for chairing the committee. He is doing an excellent job with an exceptionally fine group of Brothers.

Many of our Fall activities will soon be starting. I would encourage you to read through this Newsletter carefully and Get Involved in the activities we have planned.

A special thanks goes to Br. Randy Steinmeyer, Bruce Poe and Dave Duden, for the outstanding job they did with this year's Junior Tennis Tournament.

I would also like to thank my wife, Dianne, for helping us organize another successful trip to the Dog Races. The Brothers who missed our trip missed a really fun time.

Brother Ron Cotton has volunteered to help organize a campaign to increase our lottery ticket sales. Twenty-five sales teams, with a captain for each, will be working to sell 40 books of tickets per team. I earnestly encourage all of our members to assist Brother Ron with this project. The results of our Lottery will have an important impact on the decisions we face regarding our present location. Brother Ron has organized this campaign not only to insure its success, but also to provide some fun and excitement for the Brothers involved. There will be weekly prizes for the most aggressive sellers, and Grand Prizes for the winning team !!! GET INVOLVED & DO IT FOR 80 !!

COED SOFTBALL

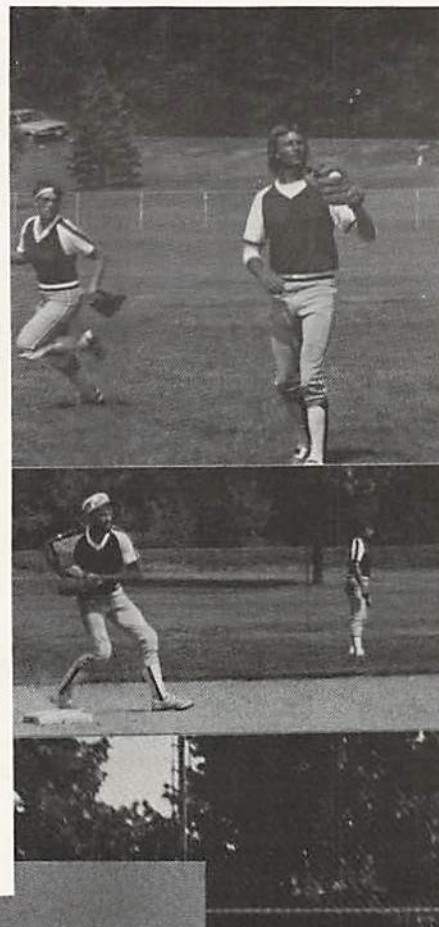
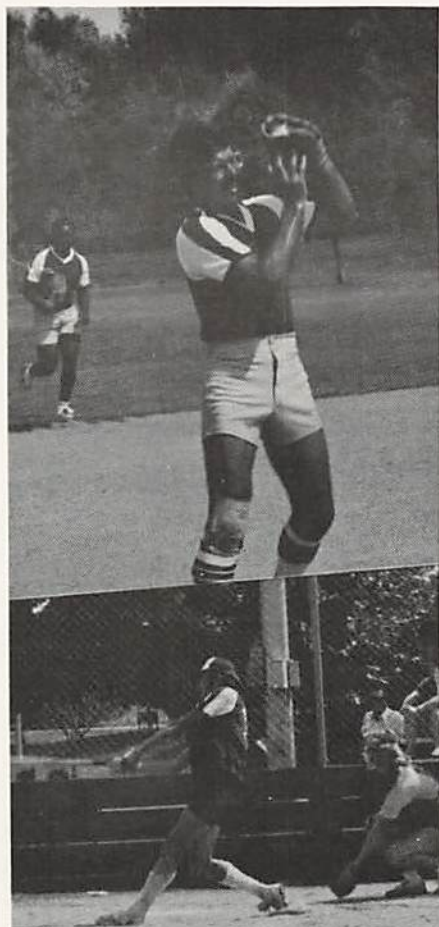

ELKS MIDGET FOOTBALL PROGRAM

The Elks Midget Football Program started Sunday, August 14th with equipment being issued to 84 players.

This program will enroll about 120 boys and girls from the ages of 10 to 14. The Elks League, in conjunction with the Lincoln Midget Football Program, issues helmets, jerseys, pants, and shoulder pads to each player.

The Elks sponsor five teams which are divided by age and weight, from the "A" team to Rookies. Our Program goals are to teach football basics, sportsmanship and have fun!

To raise funds to purchase equipment, maintain fields, and pay umpires, there are two fundraising activities. First is ticket sales, and second is an annual candy sale. We ask that you help support this effort which involves almost 1100 young people city-wide. Tickets can be purchased from the Elks Lodge, Midget Football Chairman Randy Steinmeyer, or any Lodge Officer.

During the season, each team will play seven games at the following locations:

- C – Moose Lodge – 4901 N. 56th Street
- Rookies – White & Black – Sherman Field – 2nd and South Streets

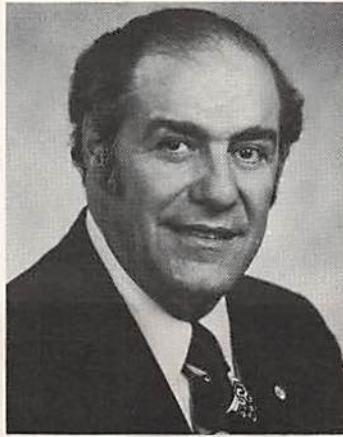
