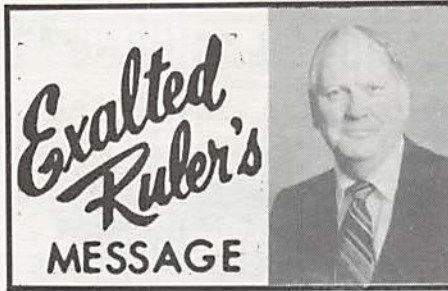

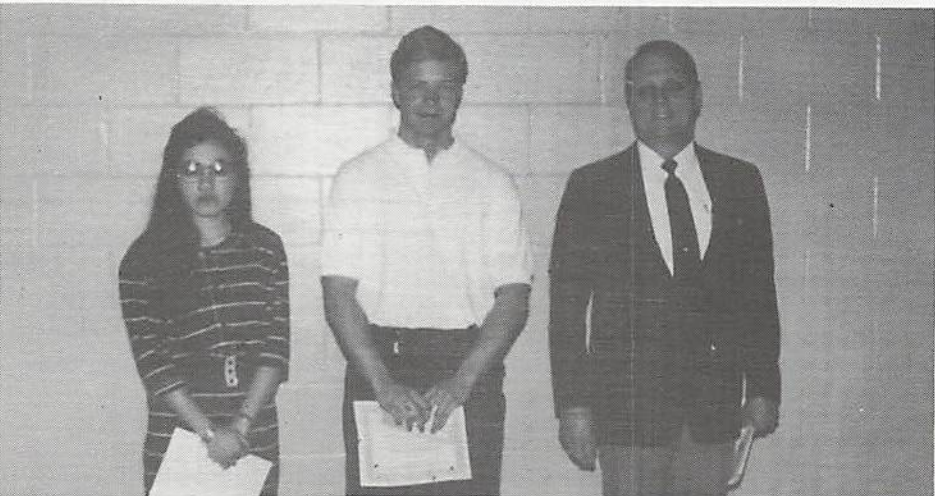

Your New Home

The lodge approved the new site location, 5816 So. 58, in the Lincoln Trade Center, for our new lodge home. To date the foundation has been poured and construction will begin soon. E.R. Dan Holmstedt has appointed a facility committee to oversee its completion. The committee is chaired by Ron Cotton, and has Bud Dietrich, Bill Woltemade, Sam Nelson, and Phil Stettinger who have been charged with providing the leadership for completion of our new home.

The new facility will have a lodge room, (multi-purpose room), which will be large enough for us to have future ritual contests in our home lodge. We have not been able to do this for the past ten years. This room will also be used for food service, parties and special lodge functions. The entire facility is designed to be energy efficient and be very functional for all operations. In addition to the lodge room there is a nice lounge, activity room and functional kitchen. This will be a lodge which all brothers can be proud of and should look forward to using.

To date we have received from brothers and their ladies, including interest, \$104,000. One person has contributed \$15,000 of this

amount. From the ten years we lived at our current location, we have been able to add another \$192,000 toward our new lodge home. By the time we close on the external construction of our new home we will have about \$300,000. With just a few sizable contributions by members, we will be able to move in.

We can be proud of our lodge. In its 100 years of existence we have established a sound and dedicated reputation of service to our community and the youth of our city. This is a reputation which so many of our brothers have strived to build and maintain. We will be able to continue this service into our future with our new facility.

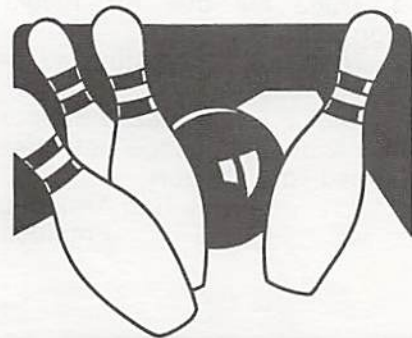
