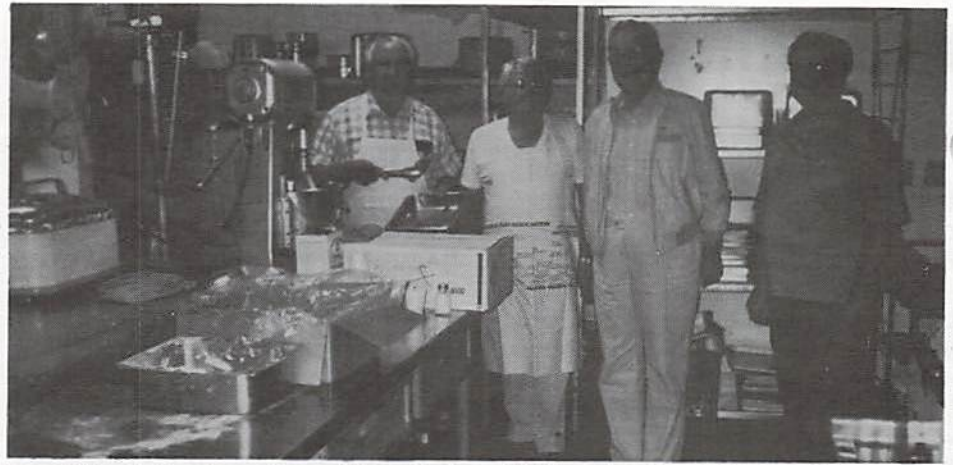

There were 25 women veterans in attendance. Lunch was provided by the American Legion Auxiliary, Department of Nebraska.

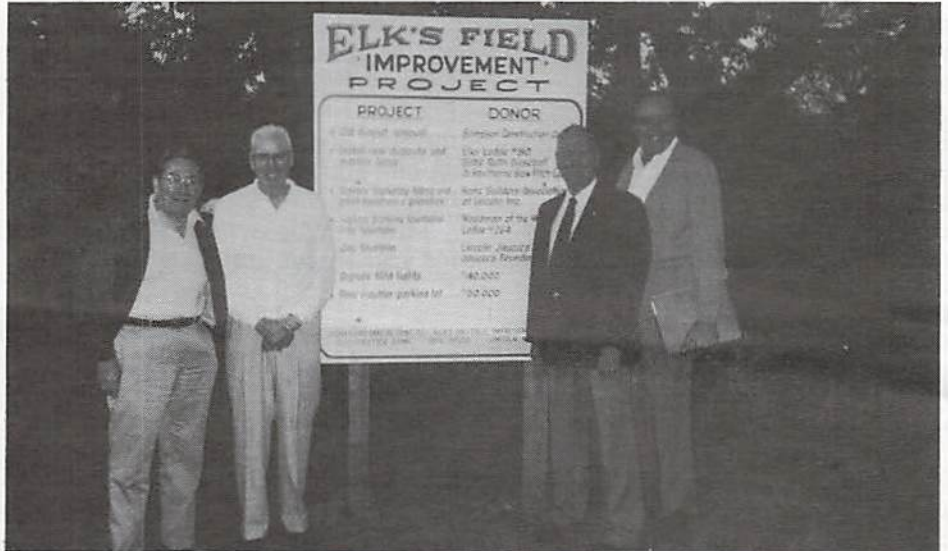

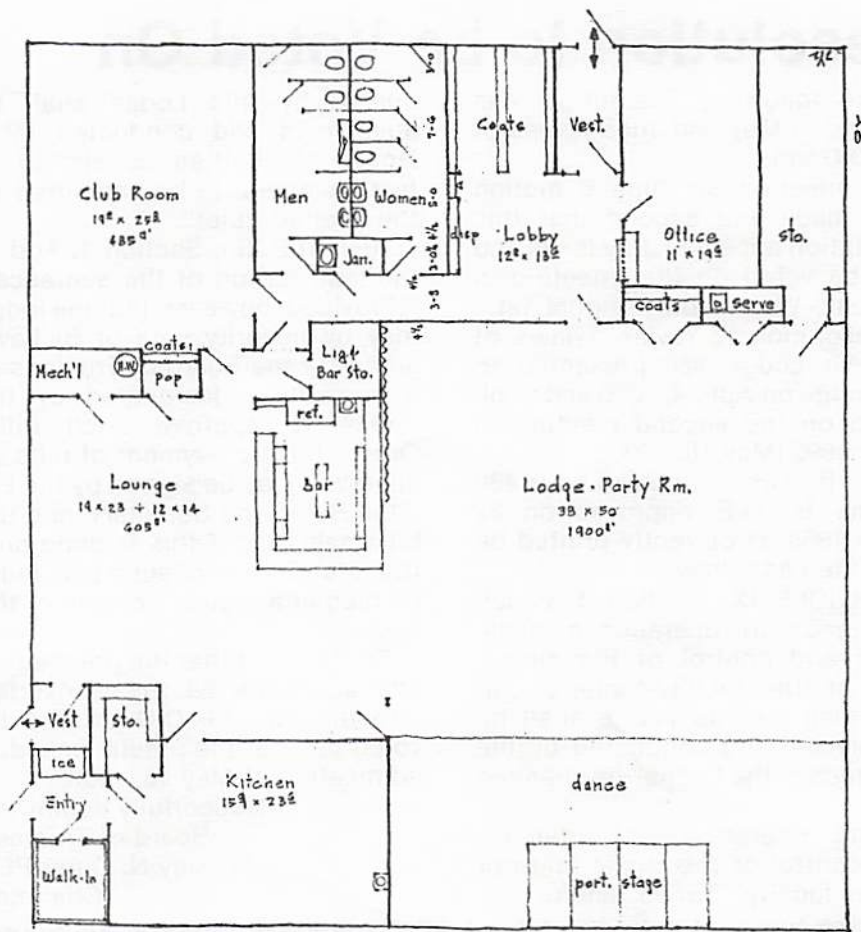

Resolution to be Voted On

The following Resolution was missed in May and June issues of Elk-O-Gram.

At meeting on June 6 motion was made and second that this resolution appear in July issue and will be voted on first meeting in August - Wednesday, August 1st.

Resolution to revise bylaws of Lincoln Lodge #80 presented to the lodge on April 4, 1990 and to be voted on the second meeting in May, 1990 (May 16, 1990).

The Bylaws of Lincoln Lodge #80 of the B.P.O.E. approved on 22 June 1988 as currently printed be amended as follows:

ARTICLE IX, Section 1 Which now reads "the operation, management and control of the Home, Club or other facility owned and/or occupied by this Lodge shall be supervised and conducted by the Trustees of the Lodge" be changed to;

"the operation, management and control of the Home, club or other facility owned and/or oc-

cupied by this Lodge shall be supervised and conducted by a House Committee consisting of five members, to be appointed by the Exalted Ruler".

ARTICLE XIII, Section 1. Add to the last portion of the sentence - "Provided, however, that the lodge may by majority vote or By-Laws authorize the Board of Trustees or a committee designated by the Lodge to approve such bills. Orders for the payment of bills so approved may be signed by the Exalted Ruler And Secretary, and the bills paid, and if this is done only the total amount of such bills must be read at a regular session of the Lodge.

Be it moved that the preceding changes to the ByLaws be inserted into the May Elk-O-Gram and be voted upon at the regular scheduled meeting of May 16, 1990.
