Elks National Foundation

In 1928 the Benevolent and Protective Order of Elks of the United States set forth a permanent Trust Fund for the furtherance of charitable, educational and benevolent activities.

How does Nebraska rank in making contributions and obtaining funds from that Trust? Statistics indicate the last fiscal year, April 1, 1988 to March 31, 1989, Nebraska Elk Lodges received 336.659% more than was contributed. Only three other States/Areas have a better record. Since the inception of the Trust we have received 111.795% more than we have contributed. There are only 2 States/Areas who have a better record than the Cornhusker State.

You may wonder how the dollars are used? Simple! They support educational needs for the youth of our State. They provide scholarships awards, most valuable student awards, emergency educational grants and vocational training grants. Tell me, Brother Elks, where could you find a better bargain, \$3.36 dollars for every dollar contributed. Students receiving these stipends will set

forth and mold values for our grandchildren and for their own.

Contributions to the National Foundation can be deducted for 1988 income tax purposes. Aside from this, Brothers we should view the "Trust" as an insurance policy that will provide the quality of leadership for the Democratic Principles that we have worked so hard to get and maintain.

If you choose to participate in the Trust you can get the forms at the front desk of Lincoln Lodge 80. You can become a Participating Member by contributing \$100.00 which can be done by paying \$10.00 annually or a Honorary Founder by making a \$1000.00 contributions by paying \$100.00 in the same way. This, however, does not mean that it has to be made in 10 installments. You may also pay it all at one time. I am certain they will take the dollars as best fits your needs.

Arlyn Uhrmacher, my co-chair, and myself, will furnish you with forms if need be. You will note that names like Geisler and Uhrmacher are not difficult to find in the Lincoln phone book.
